As I See It

A brief history of North Water Tower Park Disc Golf Course. It is my understanding that until the 1960s the land that the present Park is on was privately owned. By the middle '60s (1966?) the land had been sold or Deeded to the City. Shortly there after, an Archery Range was set up. Many longtime, North Sarasota residents still refer to the Park as "the Archery Range". There are a number of Sarasota Sky Pilots (SSP) Disc Golf Club members who can tell you about the trails through the woods , with pop-up targets, and the cement picnic tables, grills and garbage cans.

In the early 1970s (1973?) things changed . The Archery Club moved to a new location on 17th street, where they still exist today. After the "Archery" was moved, the land fell into a slumber. Less land being used means less to mow and maintain. As we all know, it only takes a few growing seasons for the palmetto networks, weeds, vines and Brazilian peppers to reclaim the land. The amount of land open for use shrank until, eventually, there remained less than 1/5th of the original acreage for use. Now, real problems started. Many times when large chunks of land, in or around populated areas, are left unattended, **lack of use encourages abuse!**

In November, 1987 the City Park Advisory Board sent me out here with the idea of setting up an

eighteen hole, obstacle (paint on trees) Disc Golf Course because "there was nobody else out there". Wrong! I set up the smack-the-painted-trees course and as any Golfer would do, played it at least once a week. It soon became apparent that we were not the only people using the park. The Park was now being used for stolen items, crack deals, prostitution and vagrants. On at least two separate occasions, arsonists tried to burn the Park down. The SSP members became well acquainted with the City Vice Squad.

Over the years, as the "painted tree course became a Professional Disc Golf Course, the Park was opened up, low level underbrush cleared, sanctioned Targets (poleholes) installed, cement tee pads, tee signs, benches and garbage cans caused the use of most available land. **Use deterred abuse!**

Today the Park sees 600 hours of free, public recreational use per week. The SSP has Adopted The Park through the Keep Sarasota Beautiful program and we hold at least one charitable event per year. By making full use of the available land, the negative elements have traveled else where, at least during daylight hours. There is a lot more to do . The Restroom, Playground , Picnic, Lighting and Parking facilities are seriously lacking.

To date, we have enjoyed a miraculous rejuvenation of the Park, however, we must continue to work for its growth and that's **as I see it...**

them with accurate information. All of these things should be easy to complete and will enhance disc golf in Sarasota. A few goals I have set (only hoping to complete) are; to complete the Lakeview Park course (all nine baskets in the ground) by the end of my term as President, finish installing the G.T. Bray course (permanently marking the tee pads and tee signs), and start a media campaign to get all of Sarasota and Manatee counties aware that disc golf is here.

Awareness to the facts that the courses are here for everyone to enjoy and the Sarasota Sky Pilots are who to contact for information. These goals are not that far fetched from reality (although secondary to what my objectives are) and certainly are attainable, but a group effort will definitely be required to realize these goals. Now is the time to work on the objectives, while there is a lull in the action. The spring and summer months have a lot of tournaments to attend and everyone will be busy practicing and traveling. If there is anything you can do to help with these projects please contact me ASAP.

Finally, the battle with the City of Sarasota over proposed changes to North Water Tower Park, has some positive notes. In the comprehensive plan for 1998, disc golf is listed as one of the activities at N.W.T.Park and in a section describing different park classifications called "Trends in Recreation" disc golf at N.W.T.Park is used as the example of a new activity. It goes on to say, "...a shift in demand or the invention of a new activity can cause the need for elimination of existing facilities or creation of new facilities", and then gives a brief description of disc golf. At last we are being recognized and acknowledged by the local government, (the planning department at least) which is what we have been asking for all along. There are still some more meetings to attend regarding the actual planning of the park, where we have been promised input. The PIC committee, Jim Widick, and myself will keep you posted on any new developments.

In the meantime, everybody should PLAY SOME GOLF! It's a great time to enjoy the courses and not sweat to death. Surprisingly, there has been a lot of rain the last few weeks and I'm still trying to get used to the time change, but don't let that discourage you. We have hole #19 to play in case of flooding on #14 and the leagues are both on the weekends now. So bring a friend and have some fun. Until next time....

The tournament finished with \$210 profit for the players purse and plenty of discs and T-shirts to go around to the players (Thanks Sarasota Sky Pilots \$100 in merchandise, Thanks Manasota Disc Sports 10 discs and several killer T-shirts and I throw in the RDG Disc and a couple of Aviaris). The night was a good success and a lot of fun. I learned some valuable lessons on running a tournament, I was able to renew old friendships and I even made some new friends and if I didn't mention or forgot to Thank Anyone, Please forgive me.

I was entered in the Grand Master Division. My Main competition was Larry Peck from Rockledge. We laid the whole tournament in the same 4-some, so we were aware of our head-to-head score at all times.

It rained, it poured, the course was wet, we were wet. It was a blast. Larry has an arm, I have good upshots. I played well the first round, but missed three 12 foot putts and ended the morning round with a 58, four over and four back.

Round two! We started on # 13, also our CTP hole. It's a straight shot, small window with a moderately sharp hizer. Larry had the pad, and left his drive 25 feet past the hole. I sailed mine perfectly, skipped and stopped four feet from the pin. CTP winner, bird, and only three back.

2nd hole, #14: Configured similar to #13, but with a smaller window, and very sharp left hizer. I lead off and hit the pin. Larry left his 6 feet off, both birdies.

#15: A fairly straight shot, some trees on the right, trees and bushes across from the basket on the left, and the basket surrounded on three sides by trees. I put my drive 30 foot past the basket, under some bushes and nailed the putt! Three birdies in a row and only two back! Ultimately, that's how the day ended.

Day two, round 3 was fairly even and uneventful and round four started with me still 2 back. We started on hole #16 and by Hole #1 I had pulled within one. There we stayed through #9. I birdied #10 to tie and he birdied #11, but boogied #12. With three holes to go, it was all even.

13, CTP : I had the pad. My drive ended about where I had thrown it in round 2, and he matched his also. I won the CTP we both birdied again and preceded to #14. Two pars. #15: My shot was 25 feet off and buried under a tree. He was short and need a long reach behind the back shot for bird he missed and ended regulation tied.

The Playoff: Hole # 1 - a 184 foot big hizer through a couple of trees. I flipped my disc, he called heads, it came up tails. As I had good luck with this shot in the tournament, I chose to go first. It stopped 10 feet to the right. Larry threw and his came up 6 feet closer. Two birds.

#2: A long straight with a fall back to the left. I had birdied this hole 3 of the 4 times, but this time I came up 40 feet short and under a tree with only a small opening through some branches for a lay-up. Larry was wide of the basket but only 20 feet away. After dropping mine under the basket, Larry stepped up for the win. I silently prayed "throw it short, throw it short", and the pressure got to him, he went wide.

#3: A Long drive with an anhyzer needed for a chance at bird.

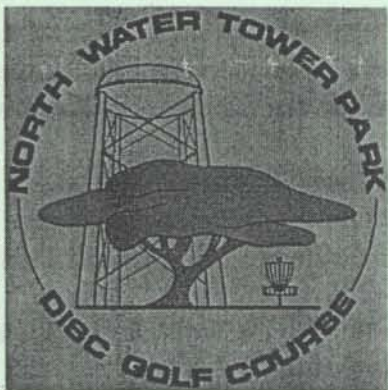

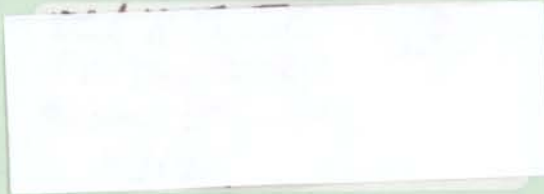
