In the most recent DISC GOLF WORLD NEWS (no. 46), Rick Rothstein (SSP #128) in his First Tee article, compares Disc Golf to stick golf. After two days of practice on the hilly terrain of Cincinnati's challenging golf courses, I felt that whoever wins this tournament definitely deserves to be a World Champion due to the wide variety of holes. Clearwater's Ken Climo, SSP#??, wins his 9th consecutive open title after being on top of the leader board the entire tourney. A truly amazing accomplishment!

Sarasota's Deb Renner SSP#??, sponsored by Carole Daviau's Allstate Insurance Company, was also in the leader group the entire tourney. She was tied for 3rd going into the final 9 round in front of hundreds of spectators at the beautiful Cabin Creek Golf Course. She finished 4th in only her 2nd World's. She won \$375 for her efforts for the week. Steven Renner SSP# ?? caddied for his Mom throughout the tourney and cashed big at Rapid Run Park by retrieving discs from the cement pond (an ice skating rink in the winter). Also, Deb and Trixie Jacob's finished 3rd in doubles. Additionally, she won the distance competition with a crush of 365' 9" over California's Annie Kreml 342' 8". In an evening ceremony she was named PDGA Rookie of the Year. An awesome week for Deb!

Sarasota's Casey Lake SSP#?? Cashes \$100+ in his 1st World's in 10 years. He tied for 14th overall in the Grandmaster's Division.

David Greenwell of Kentucky won the Master's in an exciting battle that went down to the last few holes. John Osgood, SSP#19, finished 40th out of 90 competitors, 3 strokes out of the cash.

We played 4 different courses: Oxford University, Cabin Creek, Rapid Run and Mount Airy Forest. Seven rounds on a wide variety of courses with the last round canceled due to a gambling junket in Indiana. This did not sit well with most of the players in my groups.

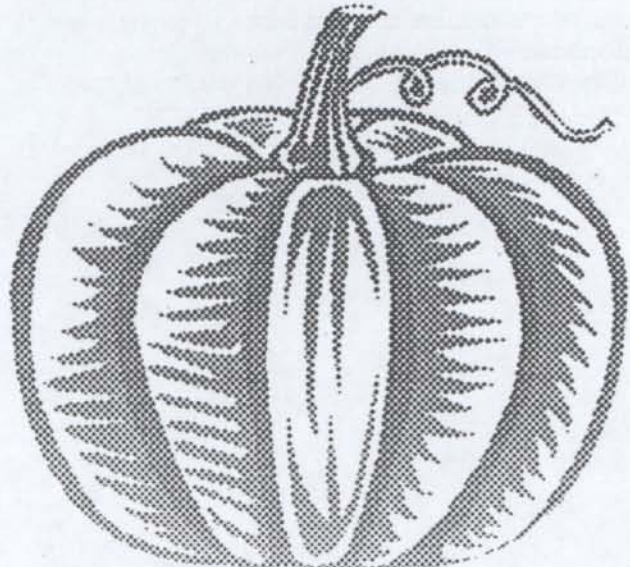
parents-we are the parents now-a-days,, government officials are supposed to be responsive to the PEOPLE (190 is a lot of votes), and other recreational activities have to share the park space. Share is the key word. We, the SSP, have to SHARE the park park with other organized activities, when they exist. It is not OUR park. It is city owned land, maintained by the County Park & Rec. department. So at this point is not a matter of "proving" ourselves anymore. We do, however, have social responsibilities as the "main" recreational activity in North Water Tower Park.

I have heard some of our members say, "We no longer set the standard, we are the standard." This must carry over to our responsibilities in the park. Many times other people come out to use the park for a walk or bike ride through the "pathways", play softball, use the picnic facility, etc... They may not even be aware of our course/sport. By walking or standing in the fairways, by the tee pads or pole holes, they may not know they are in the way. Under these circumstances, shouting "Get out of the way", won't do it. Get out of the way, of what? Remember, we are the standard. If we are legitimate and we are the standard, let us continue to lead by taking the time to be friendly and informative to new people in the park (it may even result in new members).

The flip side to all of this is that if we are friendly and courteous and we identify our course and sport as being legitimate, we now can invoke the great American principal of Majority Rule. We don't have to be overly nasty about it but we are the majority!

Please take the time to vote and come to the banquet. Also, Please take the time to thank the members who have served as club officers and committee members this past year. It is through their efforts that: we are the Borg of Disc Golf! Resistance is futile. You will be assimilated!

After searching the internet and different publications (trying to find out how every one else does it), Butch came up with some ideas about how it could work:

- Each team is made up of one male and one female player. (Only one of each, no threesomes.)
- Bring your own partner and keep your partner for the duration of the league. (No random draw, no swapping in the middle.)
- At the initial meeting of the league, a schedule will be prepared which will match teams up against each other for the next several weeks. (It all depends how many teams we have and how long we want it to last. 8 weeks, 12 weeks, etc.)
- The first two weeks will be used as "pre-season" where the team scores are used to establish a handicap.
- Each week winners will be posted and, at the end of the season, one team will emerge as "The Awesome Victors."

These are just some ideas. A lot of other issues would come into play such as: How much does it cost? Does the team pay one flat fee at the beginning of the season or is it a certain amount each week, and, does the girl have to pay or does the guy have to pay for both? 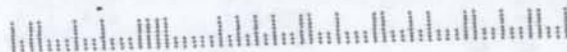

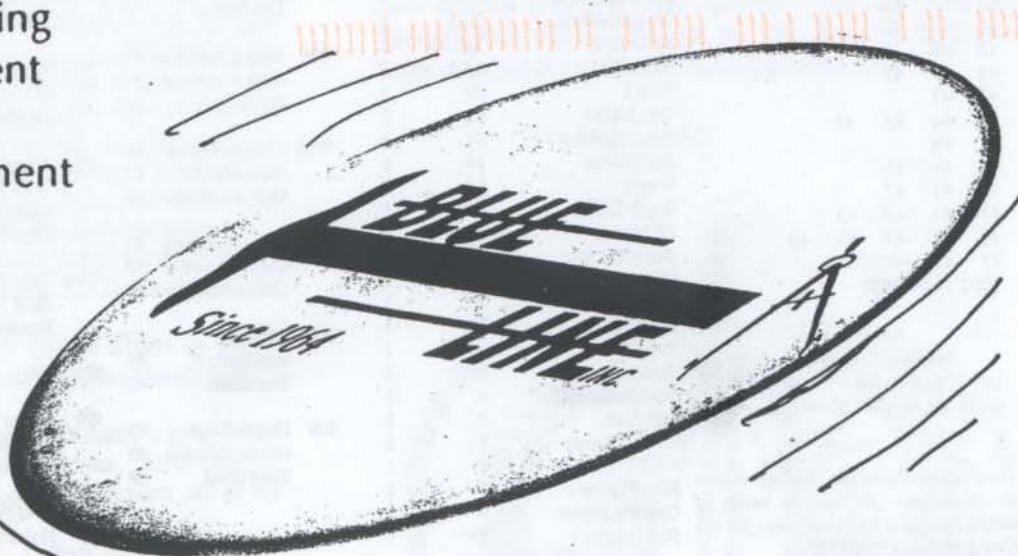
