We were also told by the City Parks Board that "all we (the City) have out there is a Disc Golf Course." This seems to imply that the Golf Club is responsible for other amenities in the park. If we follow that train of

thought, then the softball and baseball players in this City are responsible for building lawn bowling courts out in centerfield. Or better yet, the reason why there is "only a Disc Golf Course in the park," is because the CITY has not put a penny into the park in 30 years, if ever! As far as 1 ½ miles of cement, can anyone say Environmental Protection Agency? There will be at least one more City Commission meeting to attend. Stay tuned.

### Club stuff

Franklin Freedom, SSP # 86, is currently trying to define the duties and responsibilities of each committee and committee positions. If you have ideas along these lines, PLEASE, write them down and get them to Franklin. Along the same line, I have heard a number of really good suggestions and ideas out on the course. ## Rules of the Game

Every game has rules. Without them, it's not a game...it is chaos with a theme. Every disc golf player should be familiar with the Professional Disc Golf Association Rules of Play (PDGA). It is not only important that you understand the rules of the game, but it is equally important that you practice by these rules. Practicing with bad habits or playing local tournaments by bending the rules may hurt you when you play in an official tournament. With this in mind, we will review a rule or two each issue. Feel free to suggest rules that may need reviewing for future issues.

This issue will review **Rule #803.03 Stance**. This section has 8 subsections. Rather than print the rule verbatim, I'll do my best to summarize them in layman's terms. Here goes:

**Section A:** You have to have a "supporting" part of your body in contact with the ground (playing surface) and within 30 cm (11¾ inches) directly behind your mini marker and not be touching any other object (including the marker) closer to the hole than the rear edge of your mini. All "supporting" body parts must be in-bounds. So, if you want, you can stand on your head and throw as long as your head is within the required distance of the mini and no other supporting body parts are ahead of the marker.

**Section B:** You may step past the marker after you release your disc unless it's a putt (within 10 meters as measured from the rear of the mini to the base of the basket).

**Section C:** On a putt, you must demonstrate full control of your balance before advancing toward the basket after the

throw. Should any supporting body part make contact closer to the hole than the rear of the marker, this is regarded as a falling putt and is not allowed.

**Section D:** Players have to choose a stance that results in the least movement of any permanent obstacle on the course.

**Section E:** If you can't meet the requirements of Section A because a large obstacle prevents you from placing your "supporting" body part within the required distance of the marker, you must place that supporting body part directly behind the large object and on a direct line of play. All other stance rules apply in this situation except for the 30 cm rule.

**Section F:** Stance violations must be called within 3 seconds of the infraction by any member of the group or an official. When made by a member of the group, another member of that group must confirm the call. A player receives a warning for the first stance violation in a round and a one-throw penalty for subsequent violations in that round.

**Section G:** Any throw involving a stance violation may not be used. Rethrows must be from the original lie and must be taken prior to any other play in the group.

**Section H:** A player may not retrieve the originally thrown disc prior to rethrow with the exception of a falling putt. A one throw penalty, without warning, shall be imposed for retrieving the disc prior to the rethrow.

There you have it... good ol' rule 803.03. Next issue we will tackle the complexities of rule 801.03 Excessive Time and rule 802.02 Mini Marker Disc. Until then, good throwin'!

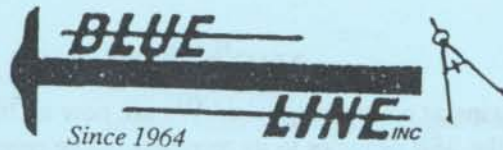

## KEN'S (not Climo's) Corner

I'm a new disc golfer but if you've been at Water Tower Park or the handicaps at Lakeview Park, you've probably met me. I really like this new sport in my future and I play frequently. I enjoy the tranquil settings and the great people I play with. This Sky Pilot is hooked. I joined the newsletter committee because of this enthusiasm and the excitement of this growing sport. I have been assimilated. My experience is very limited. At this writing, I've only played about four months, and when I am around the veterans and see their skills, I'm in awe.

My friend, Karl Peterson SSP#85, introduced me to this sport and he suggested that I write about my experiences. The following is a story about my first birdie witnessed by Sky Pilots. It was time to cross the road to play the front nine at Cliff Stevens Park in Clearwater. It would be our groups last nine holes of a "BFO" the weekend after the Coachman Classic (6-18&19). We'd played 18 holes earlier at a very wet Coachman Park and started on hole 10 at Cliff for the late round. Dan Smith SSP #116 & Judy Fryer were a team and Jim Widick SSP #1, Trina Andrews and myself were the other team in our group. We'd gotten some pretty hard rain on the back nine and everyone was pretty soggy. Upon crossing the road the general consensus among the group was that it was time for a break. I headed for dry shoes and socks and felt a little spring return to my tired legs as I headed up the parking lot to the pad at one. Out of the blue one of the Clearwater golfers, Zak "Attack" Richardson SSP #67, handed me my XD putter that I had lost the previous weekend on an upshot gone terribly wrong. It had gone

right in the middle of the rain swollen creek on nine at the Coachman Classic. Of the four discs I had lost that Sunday, the XD was the one I'd given up any hope of ever seeing again, I found the others and brought them home. Dan's team took their second shot from near the trees and appeared to be in good position to save par. My drive was the best shot of our team and I was very surprised at how far the tie-dye Cheetah had gone. I set my marker and without thinking of which disc throw, the XD was in my hand. I let it go and it crashed the chains and fell in the basket. I quickly traversed the sixty to seventy ft. to get my "trash" out of the basket; I barely touched the ground.

Jim Widick is fond of saying that no matter how bad you play, there is always one shot in a round that will bring you back to play again. *Well, I'm playing again*, but if I ever get an ace you'll have to pick me up with a sponge.
