The Great Debate Pro vs. Am

PDGA Administrator here, with a few thoughts on the never-ending Pro vs. Am debate.

The roots of this issue are before my time, basically before the time of current PDGA leadership, circa the late 80's and early 90's when the PDGA expanded to include Amateurs, and shakers such as Duane Utech began handing out tons of prizes to Ams.

The basic premise, which I believe still holds, is that the system of rewarding Ams in a number of different divisions/levels is aimed at increasing player participation in our still relatively young sport. While there is no empirical study at hand, the last several years of steady growth on the PDGA Tour suggest this system certainly is not failing. In fact I would argue that virtually everyone benefits from it: the manufacturers and retailers benefit from increased sales to events; sales beget sponsorships; TDs give Ams merchandise at retail that they purchased at wholesale allowing for profit that either goes back into the event (often to Pros but also to the Ams themselves) or for the hard working host club/staff to make a few bucks for their cause. More players get more stuff = more satisfied customers. Basic capitalism holds that increased circulation leads to increased wealth, in this case the wealth of the game.

The philosophy of current leadership has been to accommodate the desires of a growing and diverse membership by increasing the number of division levels, by sanctioning more events per the requests of host clubs, thereby giving players at all levels more opportunity to compete and have fun doing so. Of course, trying to be everything to everyone is never easy, particularly when your resources are limited.

In terms of sandbagging, I've argued in DGWN that the scores at Pro/Am Worlds, where most divisions played the same courses, and where one 18 year old kid who won Advanced would've cashed in Pro, suggest that sandbagging is not as widespread as some people might think. I've also tried to reduce the lure of sandbagging by turning one traditional pay table (Ruth/Voakes) into a series of pay tables for different divisions, all of which are flatter and pay progressively deeper than Ruth/Voakes. In 2000 the sanctioning agreement began including a set of recommended entry fees for the different divisions at different tier events. This year the PDGA will be formally encouraging TDs to distribute the bulk of Am prize value in the form of player packages to all Am participants (which could in theory leave as little as trophies to the top finishers).

A key point is that the real backbone of the PDGA is the 100-150 independent clubs and TDs who host Tour events, many of whom put their own unique touches on an event, in true disc golf grassroots tradition. It is they, and not so much the PDGA system, that determine how high Am entry fees will be, how much loot the Ams will play for, how much Am related income might find its way into the pro purse, etc.

At its present size and resources, the PDGA does not have the clout to impose a cut and dry system on all, nor is it our intention to do so. We do not want a widespread rebellion, and growth figures suggest that the existing system is working well. What we do impress upon TDs is different sets of requirements and guidelines that reflect realistic expectations of the different tiers in 2000-2001. We

The Tower Park

North Water Tower Park could be renamed Twin Towers Park right now. It's kind of funny seeing both towers there. The new tower appears to be finished, but for some reason it's not completed yet. We were told the old tower was supposed to be down before the end of the year 2000. Instead it's still there, leaking more and more water each week. Maybe they're waiting for it to rust out and just fall down. We've been in contact with the people who are contracted to remove it, and they said they are waiting for the City of Sarasota to give them the OK to proceed with the demolition. All we can do is pray they get it done before the Allstate Springtime Open events scheduled for March. If for some reason the work overlaps into March, the parking lot and 2 of the holes will be affected by a fenced in construction area (according to a plan we have seen from the demolition contractor). What a nightmare that would be. Parking has always been the biggest problem at our major events. Looks like I'll have to make contingency plans for parking just in case. In the meantime we will plan a workday just prior to the tournament to clean up the course and make any last minute adjustments that may be needed, so keep an eye on the bulletin board for a flyer.

The City Of Sarasota finally is going to upgrade the facilities at NWTP. We can look forward to a new pavilion, a new play area for kids, a larger paved parking lot, more lighting, hopefully a water fountain, and even bathrooms, among other things planned. I'm sure it will take a while for all of the projects to be completed, but when it's done the park will be a much better place to visit for everyone. I don't think anyone knows for sure exactly when all these new things will happen, but wouldn't it be nice to have most of the improvements done by the end of the year? What a great way to kick off a new year that would be. Luckily we have the Lakeview Park course to play during construction.

Lakeview Park

Looks like 2001 is the year of destruction / construction for Sarasota disc golf courses. The anticipated Paws Park for dogs is definitely coming. I have met with Dave Demarest, who is in charge of work projects done at county parks, and have an idea of what is supposed to happen at Lakeview. We walked out the area where the Paws Park is to be located and Dave marked it with paint. After meeting with the Competition Committee and the BOD, (and thanks to the Ace Fund capping) a plan was formed to play the Lakeview Handicap League until December 30th and then cut it off until January 13th. On the first Sunday in January, we have scheduled a workday to adjust the course out of the way of the Paws Park so the Lakeview Handicap League can restart as soon as possible and begin using 18 holes instead of 12. Dave Demarest was told of the plan and said that would work out fine with their agenda. Following this plan we can also assure that the Ice Bowl 2001 on January 27th will have an 18 hole course to play without worries.

Commentary

Despite many difficulties in keeping the Lakeview Park and NWTP courses playable, the SSPDGC has kept on top of all the

The Cart-Rites

Jim, the clairvoyant, saw this coming way back in the winter of '98 issue of the Flight Log. Back then I wrote and warned, "Keep an eye on the court case involving PGA (stick) golfer, Casey Martin". This is the guy who sued to be able to use a cart while playing in a tournament. Well this has now impacted the sport of disc golf to the point that there are 50-60 disc golf carts out on the course at any given time. Thanks in a large part to Cart Master, Dan "Danimal" Smith, disc golfers with carts have proliferated (thanks, Bethel) to the point where they have formed their own SSP sub-culture, The Cart-Rites! And the Cart-Rites are a demanding bunch. Just to accommodate the Cart-Rites, we now have cart parking areas around many of the tee pads, special cart paths have been cut to speed up the flow of traffic, and there is a growing need for directional signs that might look something like this:

Always on the cutting edge of disc golf, the SSP even has a holiday event just for golfers with carts - The Cart-Rite Extra Special Olympics! Held on the 4th of July weekend, this event opens with a cart parade and then quickly rolls (get it?) into the Cart-Rite obstacle course. The course is set up so Cart-Rites can demonstrate their handling and maneuverability skills along with 4 demanding putting stations, the drinking of one 12 oz. beverage, and concludes with a freestyle/cart dancing section.

More than just entertainment, these events teach the responsible cart owner the necessary cart driving skills for everyday use on the disc golf course.

With more cart traffic comes new congestion. We must prepare for the additional traffic. The days of walking bag to bag (or bagger to bagger) with your buddy down the fairway has given ground to people dragging carts behind them. I have even heard that there is a Ben Hur type Cart-Rite, you know, spikes on spokes. We need rules and regulations to handle these new situations. We need traffic laws or God only knows what could happen. An example would be when a faster moving Cart-Rite comes up on a slower or stopped Cart-Rite. Most driver's manuals tell you to pass on the left. But wait, this is Florida. So go ahead, pass on the right. And then, BAM! Traffic accident! As you can see, we not only need traffic laws but also a way to enforce them.

To that end, I took it upon myself to attach a siren and flashing light to my cart and come as Officer Cartman Cart-Rite, SSP P.D., Cart Patrol, to the Halloween Fright Feast. Authority must be respected! Tickets were easy to write as most disc golf carts identify who the owner is (SSP license plates, bag tags, etc.). This could be a new source of club revenue (although Rich Darter paid his ticket with Sky Pilot bucks).

Carts also allow you to bring more stuff out on the course. As an

also play a leadership role in the organization and delivery of the Pro and Am Worlds, and provide higher levels of support to the other Major and SuperTour events. I encourage you to compare our efforts today to those of a few short years ago...

Another interesting dimension to this debate is the fact that my recent review of current members by division revealed that our Am ranks account for virtually all the member growth in 2000. This must lead us to ask, what is the PDGA doing specifically for Ams and how can we do more? The answer is we are doing lots, again with limited resources, but we need to examine how we can do more. I'm not sure reducing the prevailing Am prize system would be viewed by the Ams as doing more for them.

In terms of the vision of the purists, those who advocate lower Am entry fees and only trophies to the top finishers, I recognize there is a dilemma with the disc golf/PDGA Tour model of Amateur reward. On the other hand, as someone who joined the PDGA as a disc golf keeper in 1987 and who has played pro almost from the get go, I've never had any problem with our definition of a Pro, even if most Pros only make a few hundred \$ every year or often \$0 on tour. The Pro \$ are getting bigger every year, and eventually they'll be big enough for a significant number of players to have the opportunity of earning a living on Tour.

There are 2 basic questions which jump out at me in regards to the PDGA changing to a different Am system. First of all, what do the member players think? As a rule of thumb the most vocal people on an issue are the detractors of a current system or the advocates for profound change. The views of a few are well known on the PDGA discussion board, but I ask you, do they really reflect the voice of the masses? The first requirement would therefore be an in-depth consultation of the members. At the same time the impact on the sport as a whole has to be assessed; less income for manufacturers and events, fewer satisfied players (believe me, Ams now expect prizes), less cash in the pro purse ... is change really needed THAT badly?

The second question involves the costs of separate Pro and Am organizations, or a new system of Am levels. While a separate ADGA might be the catalyst for a more purist system of Amateur prize distribution, the fact remains we are not big enough to divide into Pro and Am arms or separate entities. Consider the costs of separate administration (150% of current overhead), costs and time of potentially 2 governing boards, not to mention getting clubs to segregate their events and event management, or the dissatisfaction of Am players who have to pay separate membership fees in order to compete at ADGA and PDGA events, etc. For a revamped Am system, consider costs and time of new rules books, new brochures, and a new system for everyone to slowly believe in.

In short, the issues are complex, the PDGA continues to evolve, and change of this magnitude will inevitably be slow and deliberate.

Meanwhile, my concern is that this discussion often seem to lose sight of some of the basics. Disc golf is a beautiful game which we all continue to enjoy playing and competing at. The 6000+ current member (read a unique, diverse and rowdy band) PDGA and its 350+ event Tour, while not perfect, continues to grow thanks largely to the dedication and efforts of volunteers, a handful of staff, and the Tour sponsors.

Well folks, I've just typed for 2 hours, after hours. I hope it was worthwhile. Happy New Year to all!

roadblocks thrown at us in the past year. AS A GROUP, we have assessed the problems and come up with solid solutions to keep disc golf alive and well in Sarasota. This unity of the club is what the SSPDGC is all about and why we are so successful, in spite of the fact certain players feel they can do what they want to the courses without consulting anyone else. I'm bringing this up now because the actions of some people have to stop. The specifics are not important right now, but the result of their actions has been at times negative and counter-productive to what the SSPDGC has been doing. No one person determines how the courses will be changed and ALL SSPDGC members need to remember this. The Parks and the equipment belong to the City and County of Sarasota, the local disc golfers role is to help maintain the courses and run events on land they provide to us for free. The SSPDGC is who they recognize as the people using the park and expect us to act responsibly. If we cannot work together and do that, the Parks Dept. officials may just stop us from doing anything to the courses. Let's not ruin what we have all worked so hard to get. PLEASE no more unauthorized changes to either course. A Parks Dept. official said the police will be called if we report any work done that is not authorized. Don't make us have to go down that road, it will only make it tougher for all disc golfers in Sarasota.

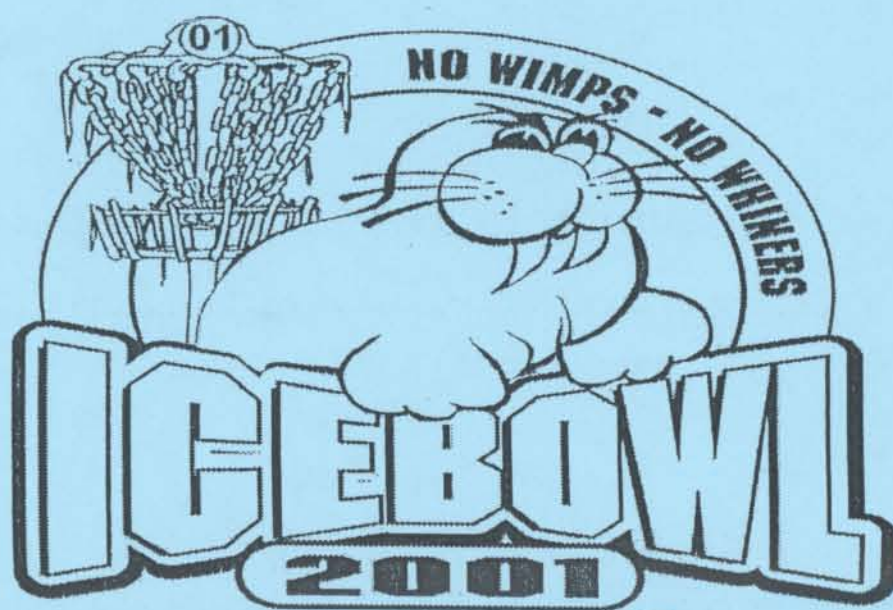
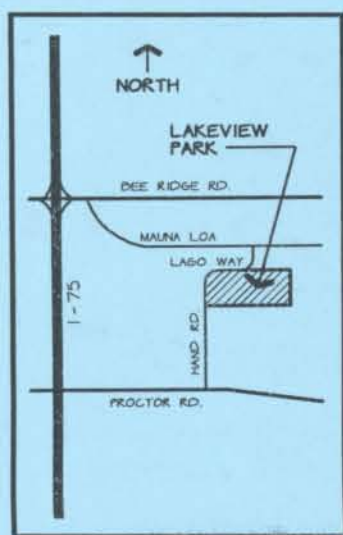
