Socket shoes will be allowed for Ultimate & Distance, but not for Guts! Bring ripple soles or something else. No carpets this year (we hope)!

The Playing Field

This year, participants ONLY will be allowed on the field on Sunday. Even your mother sits in the stands. Please HELP!

Competition Frisbee

A new model Pro and Super Pro mold will be finished by August 1. One of each sample will be air mailed to you. Practice with the new models because that's what we will be using (we think they will be the best yet!).

Guts

We are going to experiment with some modifications of the game that we hope will improve the play, provide balance, and make the sport more interesting for spectators. The rules will be changed as follows:

Fault Lines - 17 yards apart (Women's Guts will remain 15 yards)

Foot Faults - Throw over - no part of the body may pass over the fault line during or after the throw. The team captain of the throwing team (or his alternate) will call the fault.

Rotate Throw - Each team will provide the game director with a throwing list similar to a batting order. This order will be followed throughout each individual game. ie: a different thrower will throw each time, in order.

Playing Positions

The playing field will have positions defined by throwing lanes. These lanes will be 2 yards wide for each position and 5 yards deep. All throws must start and end within the confines of this zone. Defense positions may be changed once only during each game.


Recording

A new standard rating form will be used that credit each player with:

- Good Throws
- Bad Throws
- Point Throw
- Catch
- Tip up
- Assist Tip
- Missed Point (charged to last person to touch Frisbee)

These points will become a permanent record of each serious player. This will provide a system of ratings similar to baseball players and hopefully, improve spectator participation.

The Court



Distance-Accuracy

(new event) Distance throws will be made down a corridor 5 yards wide. If the Frisbee hits in the corridor, the full distance will be recorded. Hits outside will be measured to the corridor and that distance will be subtracted from the total. Each player will make 5 throws - total distance will be divided by 5 and the average will stand as the record. This will be added to World Class with a minimum 40 yard average required. The five throws may be any style.

World Class

Same as '74 plus Distance Accuracy. Boomerang throws will be excluded in Rose Bowl due to poor wind conditions.

Frisbee Golf

Golf will hopefully be played on the City of Pasadena's new permanent Frisbee Golf Course if it is completed on time. Rules will be:

1. Throws will be made with front foot on spot where Frisbee landed.
2. If the Frisbee lands in a tree, above your reach, there is a one-stroke penalty.
3. Holes will be 3" pipe, 5 feet high.

Note: If course is not completed, a temporary course will be laid out.

Style (Individual)

Individual elimination will be held indoors. Judging will be 7 rotating players. The best catch will be rated 10, a miss rated 1. Twelve throws will be made by the thrower chosen by the catcher. The catcher will be judged on 10 catches chosen by the catcher immediately after a catch or a miss. If the first 10 are chosen, the last 2 will be cancelled. The catcher must choose prior to judges flashing score cards. Judges will have cards from 1-10. A drop is 1 and a simple one-handed catch is 2. A spectacular tip-airbrush, behind the back, stuffed and inverted finger spin combo, quickly and expertly returned, could rate 10. The top 5 men and top 3 women will go to Finals on Sunday.

Style (Pairs)

A 20-throw (10 each), continuous sequence, will begin with Style catches and quality of return judged. The entire continuous performance will be rated from 1-10. A miss will deduct one point unless in the opinion of the judges, the recovery was so spectacular as to offset the miss. The top 2 teams will go to the Finals on Sunday.







STYLE

Individual

Preliminary judging will be done by competing players. Pools will be established based upon the number of contestants. Twelve throws will be made by the thrower chosen by the catcher. The catcher may "call off" two throws. Only ten catches will be considered in judging. Judges should score each of the ten catches and re-throws from 1 to 10. Total points will constitute score. The top 6 players will qualify for the finals on Sunday. Finals will be the same format, scored by seven judges.


Pairs

Preliminary judging will be done by competing players. Pools will be established based upon the number of pairs. Each pair will have five minutes to perform. Judges will score the entire performance from 1 to 10. The top 4 teams will qualify for the finals on Sunday. Finals will be on the same format, scored by seven judges.

ACCURACY

1975 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each competitor will make 12 throws at 15, 25 and 35 yards; 3 straight, 3 right curve, 3 left curve and 3 hover. Each flight must pass through the appropriate hoop on the target frame. Total hits will constitute overall score.




Top three qualifiers will compete for World Title in Rose Bowl. (No carry over score; players compete in reverse order of qualification finish.)

REQUIREMENTS FOR
WORLD CLASS FRISBEE MASTER

General Requirements:

1. All required throws and catches must be completed within one hour (elapsed time).
2. Failure to complete any one requirement in five attempts at that requirement results in disqualification.
3. Qualification Court:



Candidate may choose either end of court for any throwing or catching group.

Throwing Flights (30 yards to catcher in 12-foot diameter circle)

Thrower must accomplish each of the following throws, three times in five attempts, using each of three different deliveries (i.e., backhand, sidearm, underhand, thumb flip, etc.)

- A. Straight flight (may not cut 4 yard lane)
- B. Hover flight (two different deliveries; must be over the thrower's head at some point in flight, and on a flat, floating or downward trajectory when caught).
- C. Right curve (must cut 9 yard lane at some point in flight).
- D. Left curve (must cut 9 yard lane at some point in flight).
- E. Skip flight (single skip only).


Catching Flights (30 yards within 4 yard diameter circle)

Catcher must execute each of the following catches three times in five attempts. Bad throws will not count as attempt.

- A. Behind the back catch
- B. Between the legs catch
- C. Behind the head catch
- D. Freestyle tip catch (4-tip minimum to any trick catch; clear trick catch with judge prior to attempt).

Distance Requirement

The candidate must throw into the target area using two different delivery styles, given five sets of five throws for each delivery to make three successful throws. If the competitor qualifies on the first set of five throws with one delivery style, he then has 4 sets to qualify with another delivery.

In all throwing requirements where the phrase "using each of three different deliveries" is used, this means that the player must, for example, make three out of five right curves using the backhand, three out of five right curves using the sidearm and three out of five right curves using the overhand wrist flip. Similarly in distance, he must make three out of five successful throws, using for example, the backhand, and three out of five using the sidearm.


QUALIFICATION FOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

Candidates who successfully complete the requirements for World Class Frisbee Master with the least number of attempts, will compete for the World Frisbee Championship on Sunday, August 24. A cut-off mark will be established prior to the Sunday event.

Finalists will attempt each of the required flight sets using one delivery of their choice for each set. They will also attempt all of the catching sets. Total misses on both catches and throws will constitute score.

ROSE BOWL 1975
 WORLD FRISBEE CHAMPIONSHIPS
 ULTIMATE FRISBEE

1. Frisbee: 1975 Rose Bowl 141G Model
2. Playing Field: 60 yards long and 40 yards wide. One line is drawn to divide the main field into two 30 yard sections. Both end zones are 40 yards wide and 20 yards deep. The Hot Spot (H) is a rectangle 10 yards wide and 15 yards deep. It is centered widthwise in both end zones starting 5 yards behind the goal line and extending to the back of the end zone.



If the Frisbee is not caught with both feet in bounds, possession is lost at the lateral boundary. Play resumes at that point when both teams are ready, with the thrower having one foot on the boundary line.

3. Time: Two 12 minute halves (running time); six minute halftime.
4. Throwoff: Play begins with the throw-off. The captains of the two teams flip a coin to determine which team will throw or receive, or choice of goal. The teams shall alternate throw-offs at the beginning of each period. The throwing team lines up as follows: throwing player on the goal line, six players down field as far as their mid-line. The receiving team must stand on their goal line without changing relative position.

4. Throw-Off (cont'd)

The player on the goal line throws the Frisbee towards the other team. As soon as the Frisbee is released, the receiving team may cross their goal line. The players on the throwing team may not cross their mid-line until the Frisbee is caught or touches the ground. No player on the team throwing may touch the Frisbee in the air before it is touched by a member of the receiving team. The receiving team may catch the Frisbee or allow it to fall to the ground without touching it. If a member of the receiving team successfully catches the throw-off, that player has possession at that point.

If the receiving team touches the Frisbee and fails to catch it, the team which threw off gains possession of the Frisbee where it is stopped. If the Frisbee is allowed to fall untouched to the ground, the receiving team has possession where it is stopped.

If the Frisbee goes out of bounds before crossing the goal line, the receiving team makes the immediate decision of:

- (1) Gaining possession at the point the Frisbee went out of bounds; or
- (2) having the Frisbee thrown off again. If the Frisbee goes out of bounds after crossing the goal line, the receiving team gains possession on the goal line at the closest corner.

5. The Play: No walking or running with the Frisbee is allowed. The Frisbee may be thrown in any manner. Hand-offs prohibited; Frisbee may not be knocked out of the thrower's or receiver's hand. Frisbee must be passed from the point it is received; however, should a player take steps obviously not required to stop, he returns to the point where he gained possession and play resumes.

5. The Play (cont'd)

The thrower may pivot on one foot. Only one (1) defender may guard the thrower. When a pass is not completed, defense gains possession where the Frisbee stops. Players may not catch their own throw unless it is touched by another player. Tipping to one's self is not permitted.

6. Zones of Play: During play, each team must have at least one player behind their mid-line. Should a team not keep the required player in that zone, it will be considered offsides. This will result in a turn over at the line where the infraction occurred.

7. End Zones: When a turnover occurs in the defending teams end zone, they must begin play at the turnover point, or at the goal line. If a team gains possession in the end zone which it is attacking, the offense begins play at the goal line.

8. Fouls: Throwing Fouls: The definsive player may not touch the thrower when he releases the Frisbee.

Catching Fouls: Any player may attempt to catch the Frisbee, but he may not initiate physical contact with another player while ignoring the Frisbee.

Offesnive Fouls: The thrower may not push the defender. Offensive players must actively attempt to exchange the Frisbee (no stalling). Extended possession by one player results in a turnover.

9. Scoring: A goal is scored when an offensive player has two feet in the end zone after receiving a pass from a team mate. A player in possession may not score by running into the end zone. If the pass is completed so that the receiver lands with both feet in the Hot Spot, his team is awarded 5 points. Goals scored outside the Hot Spot are worth 3 points.

9. Scoring (cont'd)

Foul Throw: The player fouled calls "Foul", play stops and the player fouled takes a foul throw. Whether successful or not, he then regains possession at the point of the infraction. Should the foul occur in the end zone, possession is regained after the foul throw on the goal line. If the pass is completed, the foul is automatically declined.


The player fouled makes a decision of which direction he will throw and a receiver on his team. The receiver proceeds to the Hot Spot and the thrower goes to the mid-line. The thrower attempts to complete a free pass (no defenders are allowed to interfere) to his receiver. If the Frisbee is caught in the Hot Spot, the successful foul throw is worth 1 point.

10. Substitutions: 1) After a goal, before the ensuing throw-off. 2) To replace injured player.

2. Playing Field - The Playing Field will be located at Oak Grove Park, Oak Grove Boulevard, La Canada, for the eliminations which will be held Thursday, August 21, Friday, August 22, and Saturday, August 23, (if necessary).
3. Schedule - The schedule for the elimination matches will be posted at the Guts Field Thursday morning.
4. The Play -
 - A. Two teams consisting of five players each will line up behind fault lines which are fifteen meters apart.*
 - B. The Court and Playing Positions -



The Playing Field will have positions as defined in Figure 1 above. Each Playing Position will be two yards wide. All throws must end within the confines of the two-yard Fault line for each position. Defense positions may be changed only once during each game.

C. The Throw -

A throw is considered legal as long as the receiver can catch the Frisbee without crossing the Fault line, without jumping into the air, or, in the case of the Left Wing or Right Wing positions (See Fig. 1) without moving sideways beyond the stance

J. Statistical Recording - A new Standard Rating Form (see sample attached) will be used to credit each player with:

1. Good Throws
2. Bad Throws
3. Point Throws
4. Catch
5. Tip up
6. Assist Tip
7. Missed Point (charged to last person to touch Frisbee)

These statistics will become the permanent record of each serious player. This will provide a system of ratings similar to baseball players and hopefully, improve spectator participation.*

he assumes prior to each throw. The Frisbee must cross the receiving fault line in a position that is less than vertical.

- D. Foot Faults - Throw Over - No part of the body may pass over the Fault line, or to either side of the two yard position fault zone, during or after the throw. The team captain of the throwing team (or his alternate) will call the fault. Caught throws or bad throws will be considered completed and will not be thrown over.*
- E. Throwing Order - The throw will rotate, with each position throwing once, rather than the catching position continuing the throw. Prior to each game, the team captain will provide the Game Director with a list similar to a batting order. The list will consist of the player name and his order; i.e., John Doe - 1, John Smith - 1, etc. This order will not be altered during any game.*
- F. Substitutions - Only one substitution during the tournament will be permitted and only if an injury is involved. Substituted players may not resume play.
- G. The Catch - The Frisbee must be caught cleanly in one hand only. Trap catches against the body are considered a miss. However, the Frisbee may bounce or ricochet from player to player any number of times prior to the final catch. Also, a catch is considered fair if caught by two players, provided each player uses only one hand.
- H. Point Scoring - One point is awarded the throwing team for any legally delivered throw that is not properly caught. One point is awarded to the receiving team if the throw is not catchable as described in C. above. The team captain of the Throwing team will rule whether or not a throw was catchable. The captain of the Receiving Team will rule whether or not a catch was cleanly made, and whether or not the Frisbee crossed the Fault line in a less than vertical attitude. If a dispute arises, the throw is repeated. All disputes will be discussed between team captains only.
- I. Game & Match - Each game of Guts Frisbee is won by the first team to score twenty-one points, provided the margin over the opponents is at least two points. A Guts Frisbee match is won by the first team to win two games.
