# Frisbee® Championship Events

## Maximum Time Aloft

M.T.A. is one of the most demanding of all flying disc disciplines. Good performances require strength, control and an extensive knowledge of the nature of disc flight. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Time is measured from release until first contact in the catching attempt.

U.S. Record — 12.9 seconds — Steve Gottlieb, Berkeley, California.

World Record — 15.0 seconds — Ken Westerfield, Toronto, Ontario.

Women's Record — 9.0 — Monika Lou, Berkeley, California.

Senior Record — 6.8 seconds — Jack Roddick, Shippensburg, Pennsylvania.

## Throw, Run & Catch

T.R. & C. holds all the challenges of M.T.A. plus requiring that the player be a swift runner. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Distance is measured from point of throw to point of first contact in catching attempt.

World Record — 234 feet — John Kirkland, Boston, Massachusetts.

Women's Record — 143 feet — Monika Lou, Berkeley, California.

Senior Record — 116 feet — Ralph Williamson, Seattle, Washington.

## Distance

More powerful players, better technique and improved discs have pressed the distance barriers well past the length of a football field.

World Record — 412 feet — Dave Johnson, Ocean Bluff, Massachusetts.

Women's Record — 283 feet, 6 inches — Susanne Lampert, NY City.

Senior Record — 190 feet — Ed Headrick, La Canada, California.

## Accuracy

Each player takes total of 28 throws from seven different distances and angles. The target is a 67-inch diameter hoop.

World Record — 20/28, Dan Roddick, Sierra Madre, California.

Women's Record — 15/28, Monika Lou, Berkeley, California.

Senior Record — 11/28, Ed Headrick, La Canada, California.

## Frisbee® Disc Golf

One of the most exciting developments in Frisbee play is the public acceptance of disc golfing. Many club and municipal courses have been experiencing very heavy usage. Play is analogous to ball golf except that fairways are shorter and much more restricted. Holes are completed by either striking objects on informal courses or hitting Disc Pole Holes on standardized courses. The Disc Pole Hole is designed to hold the Frisbee and thus remove uncertainty about close putts.

## Freestyle

Freestyle is the "hotdog" aspect of Frisbee play. Based on the throw and catch fun of the beach and backyard, Freestyle has become an extremely challenging and beautiful aspect of competitive play. Players are judged on a 1-10 scale based upon subjective evaluation of level of difficulty, creativity, consistency, etc. Each pair gets five minutes to perform.

## TEAM GAMES

### Guts Frisbee

Two teams of five players face each other across a 14-meter neutral zone. The Frisbee is thrown at great velocity across this zone with points being scored for wild throws or missed catches. All throws must be caught cleanly in one hand. The Professional model Frisbee is used for Guts Frisbee.

### Ultimate Frisbee

A field game played with seven players on each team, Ultimate Frisbee has become extremely popular with club, high school and college teams. The Frisbee is moved from player to player by passing and goals are scored by throwing to a team member in the endzone. The Master model Frisbee is used for Ultimate play.

# 1976 IFA National Championship Series

The IFA National Championship Series provides a systematic method by which the players may qualify for an invitation to the World Frisbee® Championship. Each Series Meet has at least one national championship event on its schedule. The winner of that event automatically qualifies for the trip to the World Championships. Players may also qualify by accumulating Series points at the various meets. For example, at the Southeastern Meet, the Eastern National Accuracy title was determined. The winner of that event qualified for a chance to compete at the Rose Bowl for the World Frisbee Championships Finals. The other top twenty-nine contestants in the event earned Series points towards that event. At the end of the National Series, the accumulated point totals are ranked, and more than a hundred invitations issued to those qualifying for participation in the World Frisbee Championship competition.
