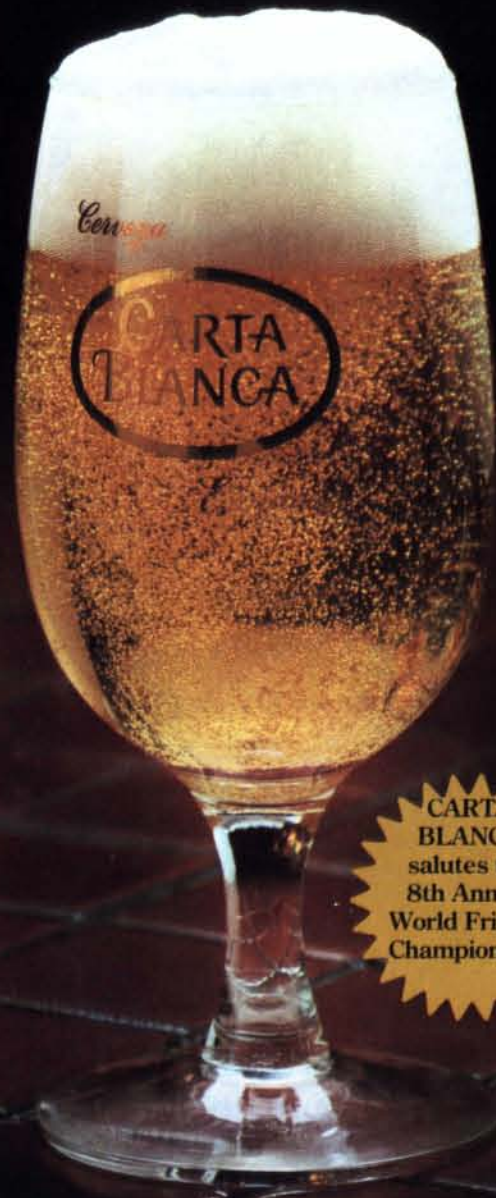

Almost since the very inception of the World Frisbee® disc Championships, man's best friend has played an important role in the proceedings.

Starting in 1975, the legendary Ashley Whippet thrilled the assembled thousands in Pasadena's famed Rose Bowl with his speed, leaping ability and appeal. Ashley was the World Champion for three consecutive years, 1975 through 1977, before giving way to an upstart named Dink.

And Dink, who reigned in 1978 and 1979, likewise became a cropper in 1980 to a proud refugee from Phoenix named Kona.

It's been apparent over the years that the sight of a dog racing down the field, leaping into the air and snaring a plastic disc, will delight audiences of all ages. As a result, the 1981 Cycle® K-9 Frisbee® disc Catch & Fetch® Contest is the biggest ever, with more than 35,000 dogs having taken part in the 760 U.S. communities.

However, Irv Lander, the National Director, and Eldon McIntire, Contest Director, point out that not only the winners are champions. All dogs who have competed in the Rose Bowl over the years are champions because they have survived competition at various levels to get there.

Lander and McIntire, who have led the way in K-9 disc competition with sponsorship from Wham-O Mfg. Co., and for the past four years the makers of Cycle® brand dog foods, have many pleasant and sentimental memories of K-9 activities.

There was Gary Smith of Maine, who was in tears as he thanked his \$5.00 pound-hound Winkie for "bringing me to the Rose Bowl." Another canine competitor who evokes smiles is "Zeke, the Wonder Dog" who is now official mascot at Michigan

State. Lande and McIntire also remember the delightful little "Ostentatious Toke" and his equally delightful owner, Zeke Linton of Texas. Toke didn't win in Pasadena, but he gained a lot of new friends, only to have his life ended the following summer in a tragic accident.

### K-9 CAPERS A WFC HIGHLIGHT



K-9 events haven't been limited to the Rose Bowl. Two of the standout performers at the last College All-Star Football Game in Chicago were Ashley Whippet and his pal, Hyper Hank. Football fans may remember that game as the one which was cancelled in the second half due to heavy rain. But during halftime, when Ashley and Hank were going out for different disc on a crossing pattern, the wind took one away, so they both went for the same platter with Ashley tipping it and Hank making the catch. The crowd went wild.

Ashley and Hank, along with Lander, McIntire and Ashley's owner, Alex Stein, also performed at the White House, helping Amy Carter's dog "Grits" develop disc catching skills. They have even appeared at the Super Bowl.

Ashley's fame was so great he was even invited to the prestigious Westminster Dog Show in New York as a non-participant entertainer.

"We are delighted with the progress K-9 disc activity has made in just a few short years," Lander said. "We are also pleased that there are proportionally more women involved in K-9 disc activity than in disc sports."

One reason for the success of the program is the strong support of Cycle®. The idea of promoting canine fitness through proper nutrition in combination with a spirited fun exercise was a natural for the dog food makers, and they have been unstinting in their support.

McIntire also pointed out that many dogs are saved from the pounds due to their disc-catching potential. Both Dink and Kona were rescued from the pounds by their respective owners, each seeking a dog which could dethrone Ashley Whippet.

For Lander and McIntire the memories go on . . . Ivy Lee finishing third at the Rose Bowl and giving birth to a litter of pups two weeks later, the three-legged "Bluegrass" delighting spectators at the Smithsonian Frisbee® disc Festival on the Capital mall in Washington, D.C., and the standing ovation earned by the retired Ashley Whippet in 1980 as he won a special distance Catch & Fetch® competition.

"We are proud of this program because of its positive values for owners and dogs alike," said Lander. "Also, it's a lot of fun for us."

Championships, a program carried out under the auspices of community parks and recreation departments across the country.

They were not the only "graduates" of the Juniors program to make their mark at the WFC. In 1978, Krae Van Sickle of New York, who had won the Juniors title the prior year, defeated his mentor and defending champion John Kirkland to win the World Title.

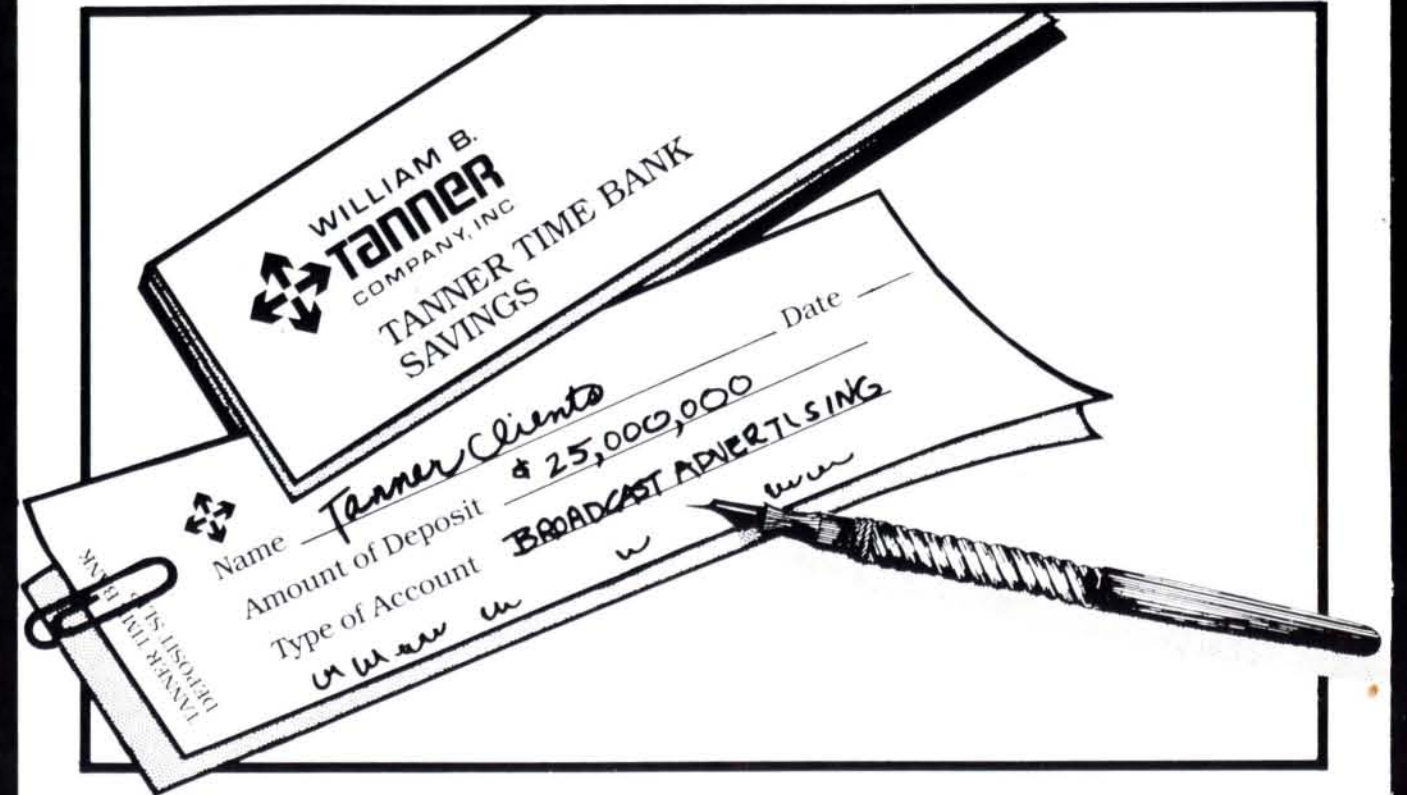

## FRISBEE® DISC CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

### Self-Caught Flight

Maximum Time Aloft: MTA is one of the most demanding of all flying disc disciplines. Good performances require strength, control and an extensive knowledge of the nature of disc flight. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Time is measured from release until first contact in the catching attempt.

Throw, Run & Catch: TR&C holds all the challenges of MTA plus requiring that the player be a swift runner. Players throw a "boomerang" flight into the air and catch the return flight cleanly in one hand. Distance is measured from point of throw to point of first contact in catching attempt.

Self-Caught Flight points are determined by evaluating the player's performance in both MTA and TR&C.



### Disc Golf

One of the most exciting developments in play is the public acceptance of Disc Golf. Many club and municipal courses have been experiencing very heavy usage. Play is analagous to ball golf except that fairways are shorter and much more restricted. Holes are completed by either striking objects on informal courses or hitting Disc Pole Holes on standardized courses.

### Distance

More powerful players, better technique and improved discs have pressed the distance barriers well past the length of a football field. Both the backhand and the sidearm are popular deliveries for this power event.

### Double Disc Court

A doubles game in which a pair defends a 12 x 12 meter court. The courts are separated by a 15-meter neutral area. Each point begins with one player on each team throwing the disc to the opponent's court. Scoring occurs when a team drops a disc, has a disc land in their court or holds both discs. Good shot variety and placement are the keys to competitive success. The 110g model is used.

### Freestyle

Freestyle is the "hotdog" aspect of Frisbee disc play. Based on the throw and catch fun of the beach and backyard, freestyle has become an extremely challenging and beautiful aspect of competitive play. Judging is done by other active players and considers difficulty, execution, variety and presentation.

### Guts

Two teams of five players face each other across a 14-meter neutral zone. The disc is thrown at great velocity across this zone with points being scored for wild throws or missed catches. All throws must be caught cleanly in one hand. The Professional model is used for Guts.

### Ultimate

A field game played with seven players on each team, Ultimate has become extremely popular with club, high school and college teams. The disc is moved from player to player by passing and goals are scored by throwing to a team member in the end zone. The 165g model is used for Ultimate play.

## WORLD JR. FRISBEE®

The World Junior Frisbee® disc Contest began in 1969 and has grown to a point where more than 1,000,000 boys and girls, ages fifteen and under, take part each year. Contestants also compete from Canada and Great Britain.

This year's competition will conclude on October 17th at the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Texas, where the regional and international champions will gather for the World Finals.

Over the years several million young people have had an opportunity to participate in this worthwhile event, which has given many of them an otherwise unavailable chance to travel and meet new friends.

Additionally, the spirit of competition and good sportsmanship is kindled and nurtured.

This year the format of the Juniors was revised to reflect the development of new and exciting disc disciplines. So it won't be too unusual if the 1981 World Junior Frisbee® disc Champion shows up at a future WFC and takes all the marbles.

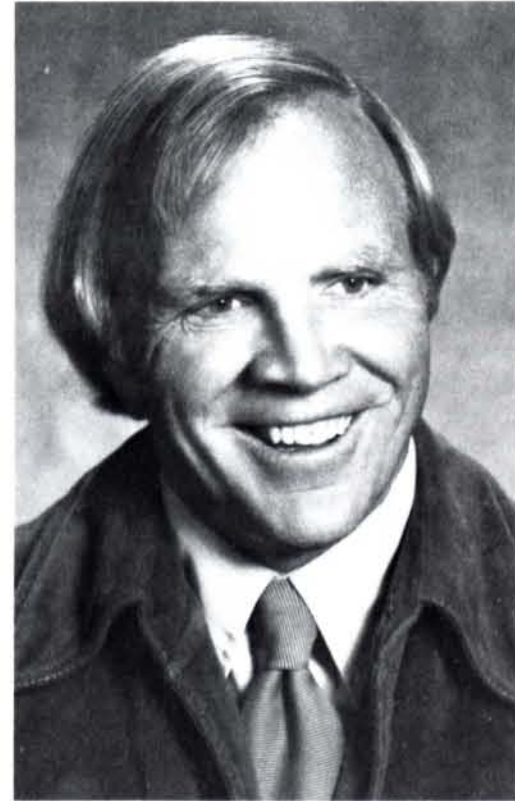
Today's Worlds Championships will be seen on national television in September and October via the Entertainment and Sports Programming Network (ESPN). ESPN now reaches 10 million homes.

The K-9 competition is scheduled for Saturday, September 26th (5 and 9:30 p.m. PDT).

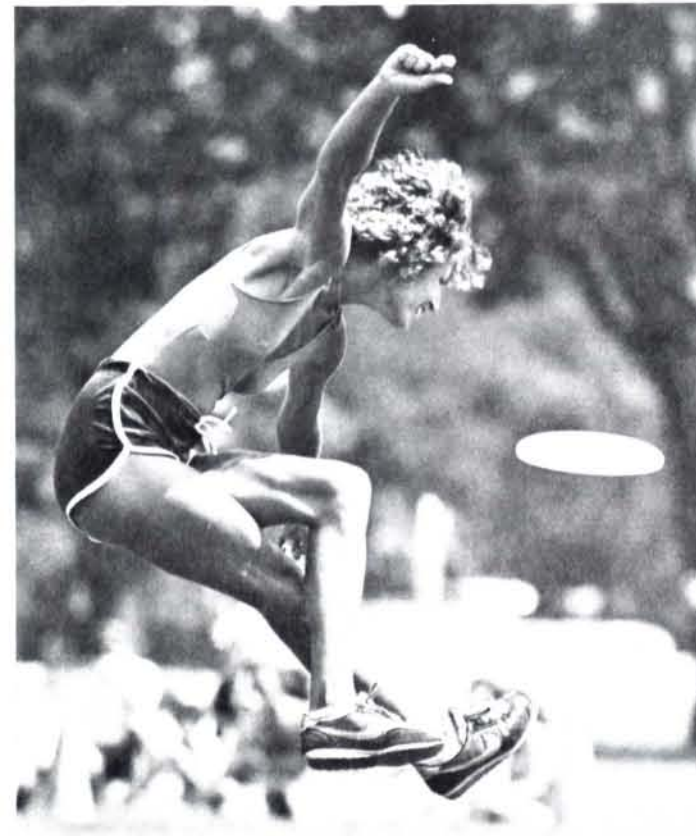
The Ultimate competition will be shown at 2 p.m. (PDT) on Sunday, September 27th with repeats in October.

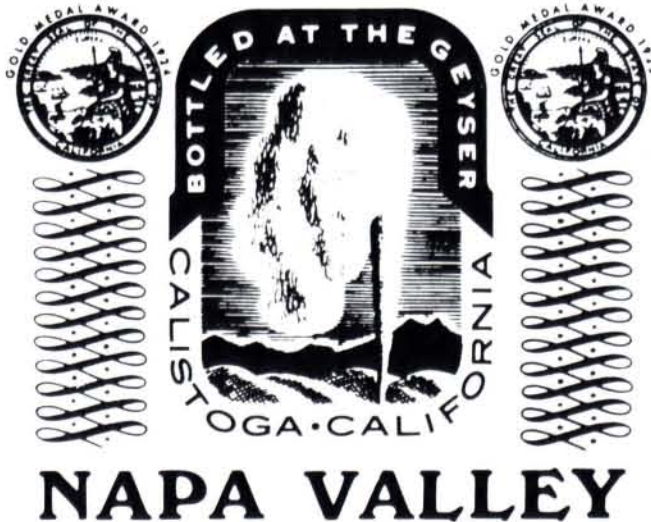
