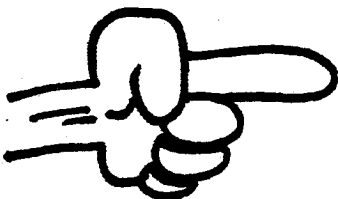

DAILY DONUTS - SOME LEFTOVERS AND NEW ONES

Yesterday we awarded Bruce Podgorski the "Mr. Consistency" prize for scoring an 8, two 4's and nine 2's. What we forgot to mention was that he had to make a 70-foot putt to save his 8.

Roger Galton of England earns today's "Mr. Consistency" award for his first four holes on Thursday. He started at hole #36. Apparently warmed up after his triple bogey there, he proceeded to ace hole #1. His scorecard after two more holes read 6, 1, 5, 5. No birdies, no pars, no bogies - the model of consistency.

Bruce Podgorski then scored high freestyle points on his final throw, spinning to a behind-the-back tip to a milked catch for an 8.51 score. The next and final group attempted rather bland, standard catches, but Thomas Pelkowski of West Germany did unsuspectingly set a new world MTA roller record: 11.80 seconds. 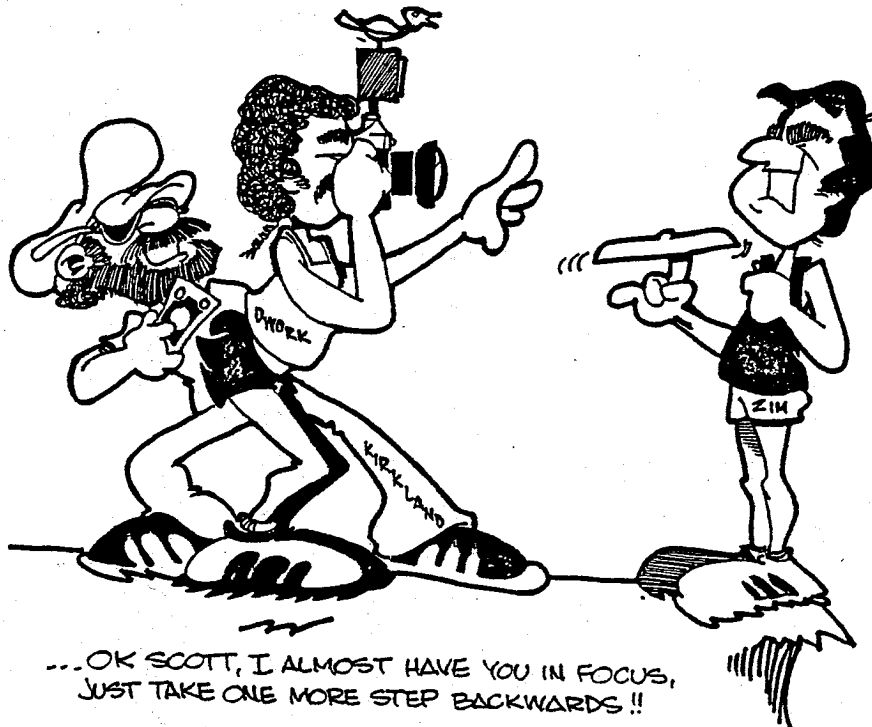

COLLECTRIVIA CONTEST #3 - ANSWERS TO YESTERDAY'S QUIZ

1. James Chisholm, age 16, of England still has a chance on Saturday to break Scott Zimmerman's World Distance Record for Juniors of 118.44 meters.
2. Bill Burns is the only WFC '81 competitor from the state of Indiana. For your information, another Indiana player has competed at the WFC before: Bruce Willis in '76 and '77.
3. The man who broke John Kirkland's U.S. Distance Record was Dave Dunipace at the NAFDS meet this year in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Van Miller then beat Dunipace's record.
4. An MTA catch is not good unless it is caught cleanly in one hand. If the player reaches back and grabs the disc on his back, it is a trap: not a good catch. The clock has stopped running with the first body contact. The best way to complete this catch is for you to get up, let the disc slide off your back, and grab it. Eric Keim claims that the catch on your back would be complete in Guts. But Stork agrees with the explanation above.
5. Diego Faure has competed 3 times at the WFC, more than any other player from France.
6. Ron Widel, the current champion in the age 45-54 bracket, has competed in 3 different divisions, but at only 2 WFC's. The divisions: Open Masters, and Grandmasters in the '78, '79, and '80 series when Ron was 43, 44, and 45 respectively.
7. Hartmut Wahrmann of West Germany is the current record holder in Maximum Wall Aloft with a time of 2.93 seconds.
8. The world record for consecutive Hacky Sack kicks is 7,138.
