DDC FINALS: WOMEN'S AND OPEN

Playing exceptionally well, G Kirkland and her partner Cyndi Birch took the Women's DDC final from Horowitz/Allen in straight games, 21-15, 21-13.

In the Open Final, East Coasters John Cohn and Paul Brenner knocked off Charlie Duvall and Scott Zimmerman, 22-16, 19-21, 21-12. This ended Lacy Park's domination of The World DDC title, but special mention goes to Charlie for playing in his 4th consecutive World DDC title game.

DAILY DONUTS Pryor Hendrix was standing outside the Disc Golf HQ, trying to figure out how many meters the 500 foot throw by a Japanese player, setting the world distance record, converted to. Having trouble with his calculations, he said, "Oh, 152.4." Disc Golf Association employee Nelson immediately looked down at the weight of the golf disc he was holding. Tossing it out the window to the unsuspecting Pryor he said, "It's yours." He couldn't resist. The disc read in grams: 152.4.

Kaufman announced over the PA system during the DDC "10 round" that a hot game was one between Stork/TK and albee/H. Duvall. albee said, "Well, I guess it's the old guys against the new." Stork retorted, "What's one lousy game in the 10 round for continued employment?" Guess who won?

Later in the round, in the final match between Stork/ TK and Hubbard/Mackey the teams made a side bet, prompting Stork to ask, "Would friends go at it this hard for a Calistoga?"

Van Miller, sitting opposite the chart, fired an open pen past albee's nose. Amazingly, it hit the chart, slashing a straight line, a "1", in the middle of the rank space across from Judy Horowitz's name, showing the women's overall winner.

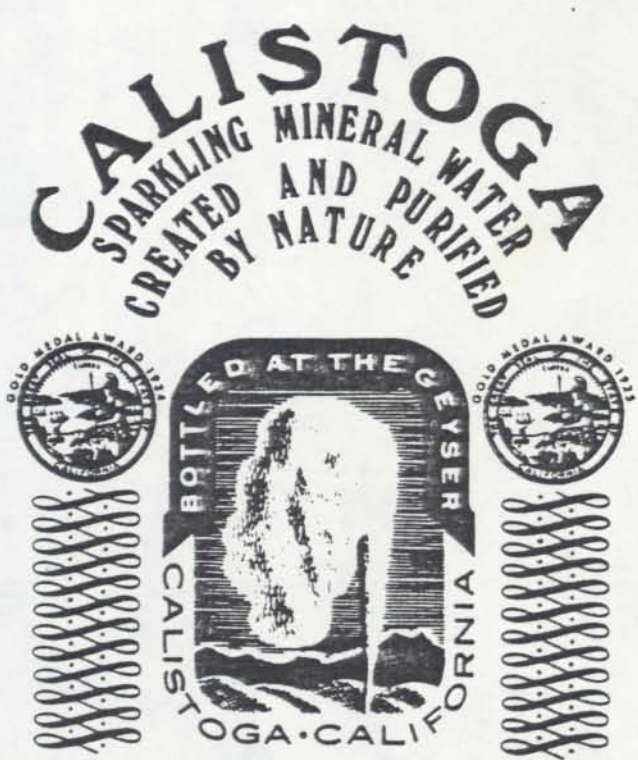
