MARATHON GOLF TOURNAMENT Earlier this spring, a ball golf foursome got a lot of media coverage when they played the best 18 holes in the metropolitan New York area - from halfway out on Long Island to mid-New Jersey. The trick is they did it all in one day using a helicopter, station wagons, and golf carts. Touring pro Ben Crenshaw, the editor of Golf Magazine, the head of the metro NY Golf Association, and one other guy made up the foursome which completed their dream round in about 13 hours. Crenshaw actually shot a respectable 77, 5 over par.

Well, if they can do it, so can we. With the addition of the Rutgers course, there are now 4 Pole Hole courses between New York (actually an hour north) and Philadelphia. On September 18, up to 27 disc golfers (limit: 9 three-somes) will attempt to play 72 holes - Mt. Kisco, Valhalla, Rutgers, and Sedgely Woods - in that one day. Cash awards will go to the best scorers on each course and to the overall winner. New York golfers will put up out-of-towners Friday night, play will start about 7 AM Saturday, and we'll all party in Philly Saturday night. If you're psyched, contact Mark Danna (211).

Gluttons may wish to play in a Best-Disc two-person tourney at Sedgely on Sunday. Maybe we'll also have a quinella on finishes at all 4 courses plus winning total score.

WORLD FRISBEE DISC CHAMPIONSHIPS: AN INTERNATIONAL OVERVIEW

So here at Rutgers University we see the staging of the 9th WFC. Frisbee throwing has progressed a long way since the initial WFC in 1974. If there is one thing that is more important than the attraction of the disc, it would have to be its power of communication. Therefore, it is more important than the eventual winners that all competitors of all countries foster the development of international Frisbee throwing and "camaraderie".

This places a burden on the U.S. competitors as the host country. Being a host requires that all members of the team be prepared to extend their hand of friendship and communicate with as many of the internationals as possible. This is because one day (one year) the WORLD FC will be held in another country, and it will be the competitors of that host country who will extend their friendship and communicate with all other competitors.

If we wish to keep our "ageless", "universal language" a viable cause, then we need to be prepared to be altruistic in our outlook and manner in which we participate in WFC's.

(Food for thought: If you have a rare gem, you do not neglect or abuse it so that it loses its sparkle or attraction.)

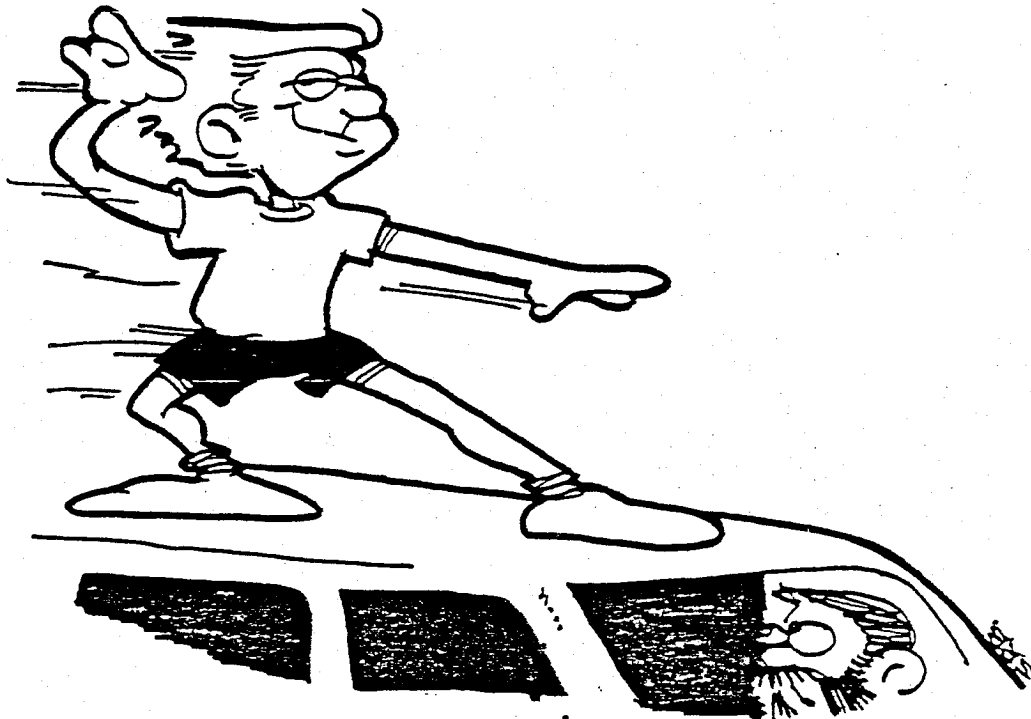
