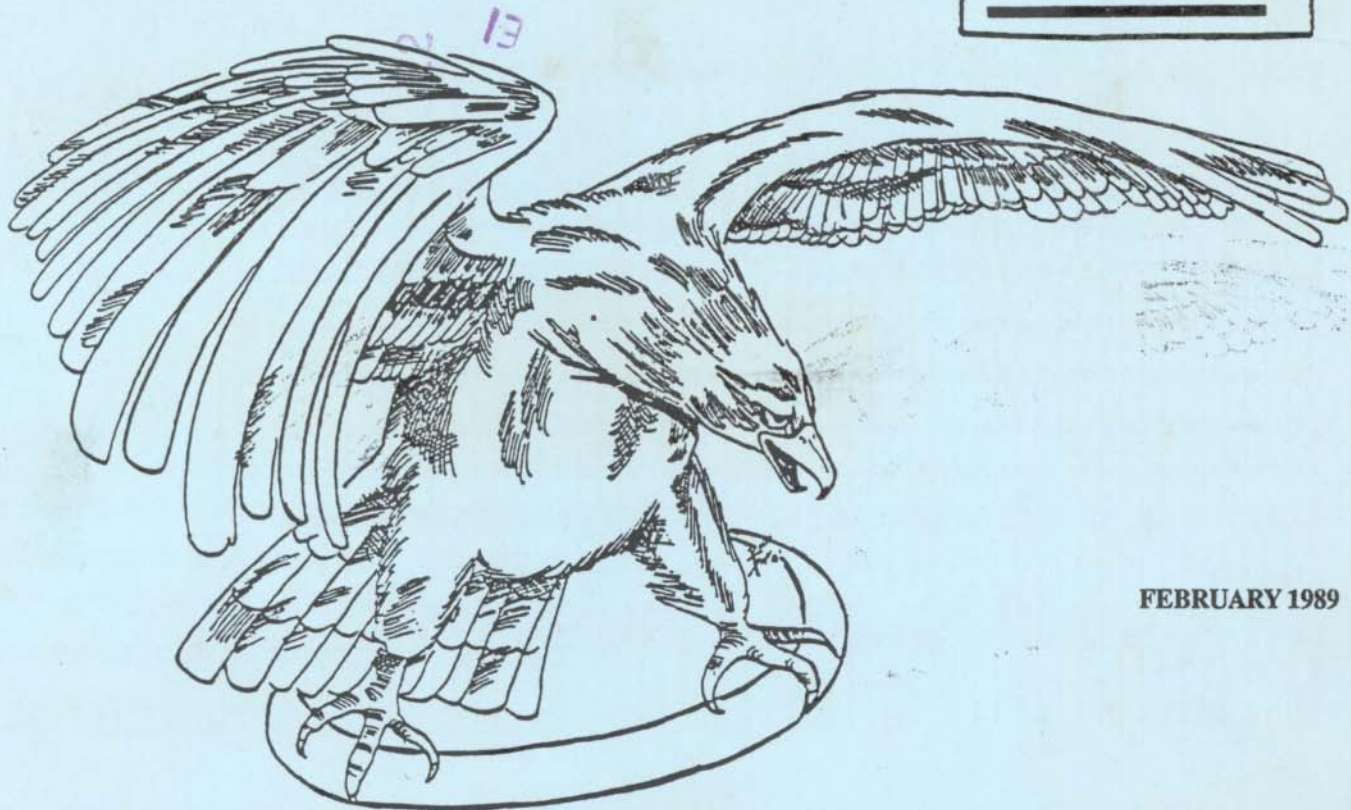

1988 WORLD SENIOR FLYING DISC
CHAMPIONSHIPS
SONOMA, CA JULY 11-16, 1988



Fine wines are not expected to reach their full character until they have aged sufficiently. Some well-aged disc players tested that theory and invited comparison with their own improving qualities as they gathered for the 12th annual celebration of senior play in the heart of California's wine country. Tom Ford, Bonnie Brendlin and the United Flyers of Sonoma put out a warm welcome that drew 46 players from 4 countries. A particular highlight was the attendance of Mr. Lin Shiu Ming representing the Republic of China Flying disc Association.

Performances were dramatically improved in all areas with many world marks being broken and re-broken during the week. By the end of the meet, ten new global standards had been established.

In Grand Masters a lively overall race resulted in three players taking event titles and John Tallent of San Diego edging Gary Sullivan of Spring Valley, California, by two points for the top spot. John took D.D.C., Freestyle and S.C.F. to put together the overall.

Senior Grand Master drew its largest field ever with six competitors. They spread event titles over five players and set records practically every round of play. Everett Willis of Auburn, California, won the overall, beating three former world overall champs in the process.

The Senior women title went to Diane Messier of Temple City, California, as she won Distance, Golf and S.C.F. to win over Susie Horn of Altadena, California, and Mary Norbeck of Baltimore, Maryland.

In the Masters division (35-44), Snapper Pierson of Coronado, California, repeated his overall win, but found it a little tougher as he had to settle for "only" 3 event wins this year. He still had a comfortable lead over two-time overall winner Dan Roddick of Pasadena, California, in second and '87 runner-up Danny McInnis of Temple City, California, in third.

In Distance, Snapper lost both the title and his world mark to newcomer Dave Tutt of West Covina, California. Dave threw an amazing 159.08 meters.

Nobody was in position to deny Snapper his Discathon title as he dusted the field leaving Jim Palmeri of Rochester, New York, a distant second. Palmeri, incidentally was dropping down from Grand Master to the younger age group and finished an impressive 5th overall among the Masters.

Mark Horn of Altadena, California, and Danny McInnis reversed the final result of their '87 D.D.C. championship match with Robbie Robinson of San Diego and Snapper as they beat the defending champions in 3 games.

The Accuracy final came down to a head-to-head playoff between Snapper and Mark Danna of New York. Snapper "beat the pro" to retain his title.

Freestyle featured an exciting routine from Don Fogle of Tacoma, Washington, Jeff Soto of Sacramento, California, and Dan Roddick. Their play broke Joe Messner's impressive stretch of 4 out of 5 wins since 1991. Joe Messner of Marina, California and his partner, Tom Gleason from San Diego finished second.

The campus golf course at Sonoma State was much to Snapper's liking as he put away Dave Dunipace of Fontana, California, by 5 throws. His 45, 42, 44 rounds didn't leave much room for error.

Self Caught Flight also slipped away from Snapper as Don Fogle set a new Masters TRC mark of 70.25 meters. In an earlier round, John Bird from Denver, Colorado, put together a record S.C.F. score of 122.01 with a 10.81 second MTA and a 62.55 meter TRC.

The annual Save The Children disc auction raised enough money to continue the WOLF support of these children over the next year. Hosting the auction at the Landmark Winery helped loosen up the old purse strings.

The '88 meet will certainly be remembered for the fine weather, the great site at Sonoma State, superb planning by the hosts and the very high level of play. Of course the personalized bottles of wine in the player kits helped make the week go well also. It was a fine time for flyin'....

The 1989 World Senior Championships will be hosted by John David and Patti Kunkle in Atlanta, Georgia from July 11 through 15, 1989. For information write:

DISC GOLF FOR CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

November 19, 1988, Bluemont Park, Arlington, Va., "A cold and rainy day"

The monthly tournament for the Northern Virginia Flying Disc Union was really last minute scheduling. Just about all of the players heard about it by word of mouth. After it was over, the amateurs got some disc prizes, the pros donated their winnings, and everybody donated a little something extra. It was a good time for all, and best of all, \$106 was raised for Children's Hospital!
