#### Lots to Look Forward to in '92

Disc lovers in the southwest and around the world have high hopes for 1992 as a landmark year in the development of disc sports. Players in the know expect '92 to be a year of breakthroughs, records and new optimism. Here are a few things to look for in the new year:

The "new" PDGA. After a year of tremendous turmoil, the Professional Disc Golf Association seems to be ready to make big moves forward. In the last twelve months, the PDGA has had four commissioners, including one whose term lasted only 22 hours.

But a recent meeting of major promoters and policy makers in Detroit may have provided a new direction for the PDGA. Look for the PDGA to have a new constitution, a major membership drive, and

a commitment to developing Disc Golf at all levels. The "Pro Tour, Inc." Another thing to come out of the meeting in Detroit was the announcement of the formation of a new business, the PTI, to help promote Disc Golf at the professional level. The PTI will be a privately funded corporation that will sponsor the PDGA's top tournaments and actively seek national sponsorship for professional events.

In 1992 the PTI expects to assist about 10 PDGA events by providing equipment, manpower, and cash, as well as expertise in marketing and tournament direction.

World's Biggest. The World's Biggest Disc Golf Tournament on May 9, 1992 will have over 20,000 people playing Disc Golf on the same day. Clubs and promoters around the world are getting behind the WBDGT in bigger numbers than expected, and hopes are high that the event will attract thousands of new Disc Golfers and create a new level of public awareness.

The latest development in the WBDGT story is the agreement by promoters to use the event as a way to increase PDGA membership. An internain a doubling of the PDGA's active numbers. The PDGA has agreed to use its resources to help the WBDGT in return.

#### Ingleside Course Opens

Texas' newest Disc Golf course is a 9-holer installed last month in Ingleside's Live Oak Park. The course is the result of the efforts of Park Board member Norman Fleeman, who wanted to bring the sport to his small town across the bay from Corpus Christi.

"We wanted some healthy recreation for our kids, and we wanted to give our park users something to do," Fleeman says. "We're also really interested in getting people to come down to Ingleside for some great tournaments."

The holes on the new course average just under 300 feet, but the tight fairways and often windy conditions create a real test for top players. The course's most memorable hole is hole #5, which dares players to go over the top of a row of trees to hit a narrow fairway lined with thick trees and brush. The first mini-tournament in Ingleside was held Saturday, December 7th.



#### National Doubles Returns

The second annual PDGA National Doubles Championships will take place this Spring at Old Settlers Park in Round Rock, TX. Last year's event was the biggest on the PDGA tour and was a favorite of players around the country, with a total purse of over \$10,000.

This year's tournament is still part of the Round Rock Sportsfest, though it may be taking place a few tional contest to sign up new members should result weeks later in the season. Promoters hope to hold the pro event after the time changes in early April in order to have daylight longer. Last year's tournament ran into the dark on the first day of competition.

### In the Bag

Gene "Biff" Barfield of Carrollton, TX has been one of our region's top players for many years, with tournament wins including the 1990 Circular Skies Over Victoria. In 1991 he moved into the Master division (for players 35 and older), and was a top competitor, most recently winning the Veterans Park Open in Arlington.

Biff, who is largely responsible for bringing Disc Golf to Carrollton, is known for his distance off the tee, especially when he throws one of his monster rollers. But he is, perhaps, better known for his very consistent putting. Recently he opened up his bag for us.

Biff prefers a **Barracuda** for drives over 320 feet. He carries a 185gm Barracuda in his bag as well as a spare, just in case. For long hyzer (right to left) shots, he prefers a 180gm **Roc**. (As we go to press, Biff says he may be looking to replace his Barracudas with the new **Viper**.)

He also carries an old style **Roc**, 175gm, for approach shots, and an original Innova **Eagle** for special situations (the Eagle is out of production). Every once in a while he'll pull out his 180gm old style **Cobra**, too.

For rollers, Biff prefers a **Stingray**. He carries two heavy ones, one of which is pretty beat up and turns over faster. Finally, his trusty putter is an old DGA **Gumble** which he's had for years.

Biff says that "it's really important to be considerate of other players and other park users to make the sport bigger than it is. Everyone has a responsibility and an accountability." His best advice for new players: "Stay with it."

Last month I was very fortunate to have been involved in the landmark meeting in Detroit. Mr. Can Am Fish himself, Duane Utech, took it upon himself to bring together most of the country's top regional promoters, idea people, and political leaders, including PDGA Commissioner Kathy Bramlage and #001 Ed Headrick.

The Professional Disc Golf Association has had a pretty rough year, and many of the promoters, as well as plenty of players, were losing faith. In fact, there had been some pretty serious talk of starting a new organization outside the

PDGA.

In short, here's what happened: we all agreed to throw our support behind the PDGA, and came up with the framework of a new constitution. On top of that we all agreed to support the creation of a new corporation to sponsor existing PDGA tournaments and to actively seek national sponsorship for Disc Golf events.

The best thing about the meeting, to me, was that everyone had an open mind, everyone knew how to listen, and everyone had good ideas. We set a very high standard of cooperation and created great cause for hope.
