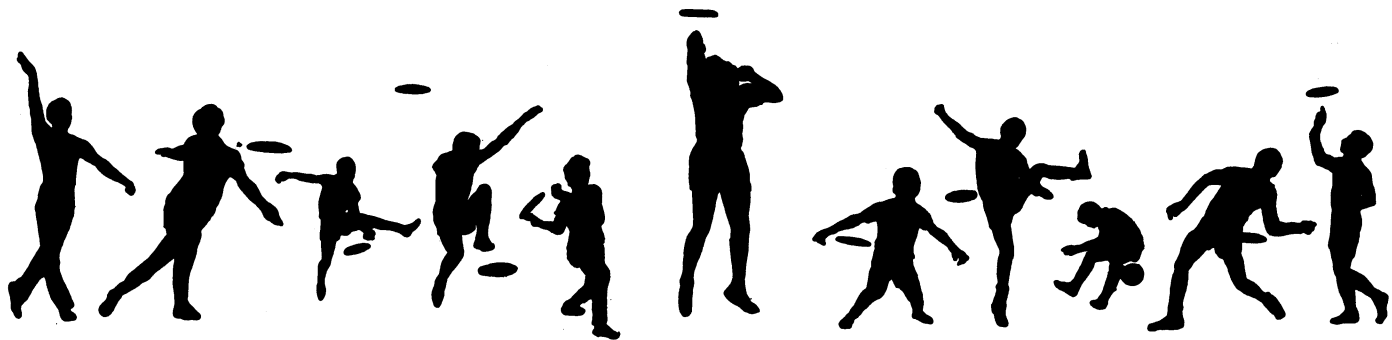

The New York Flying Disc Institute

This year, the IFA designated New York as a logical site for the 1977 Eastern U.S. National Festival, and despite some grumbling, we plan to make it the "bestival" of festivals. In case of rain - carry a giant CPI.

Disc-Over New York '77 has many special considerations, including space limitations and conflicting events in Central Park, which have made it necessary for us to have two sites (Sunday - Prospect Park in Brooklyn). Spectators will number in the thousands, the Press is expected, and great care must be taken to avoid conflicts of any sort:

Most registrants want to compete in various events, so we have devised a new system to accomodate their desires and to accomplish our goals of a) having a great time and b) showing "the people" what it's all about.

Saturday, June 25

8:00 am - 10:00 am Late Registration (\$12.00) at 306 West 76 St.

8:00 am - 9:00 am Set up in Central Park, Closed Road (72nd St., West of Bandshell)

9:00 am - Official Opening - 6 events begin simultaneously with registrants having been equally divided into 6 groups, one at each event site.

- events
- 1 Freestyle - Bandshell or Closed Road (in case of conflict)
 - 2 Golf - Frisbee Hill (brand new 9 holes, 6/77 - see map)
 - 3 Balloon Target - North End of Sheep Meadow
 - 4 MDT (Minimum Distance Travelled) - Sheep Meadow
 - 5 Accuracy - Central area of Closed Road
 - 6 Collector's Corner - North End of Closed Road



10:30 am - FIRST ROTATION (every 1½ hours) Each group moves on to the next event (ie: Freestylers move to Golf, Golfers move to Balloon Target, etc.) Every group must stay together (intact).

Registrants are not required to compete in any event but must participate as score keepers, spotters, timers, etc. More important, they will act as liasons between the festival participants and the general public, many of whom will have questions about what's happening. The public should be encouraged to "compete" and should be allowed to fit in where possible. There will be two separate score sheets at each site, one for the registrants and one for the public. At the end of each hour and a half (before Rotation) the winner among the nonregistrants should be awarded a tournament disc as a prize. Registrants' scores will be tallied at the end of the Festival to determine the prize winners (3 prizes for each event except Freestyle and Ulitmate which will not be judged). Prizes for the Balloon Target are awarded on-the-spot when and if anyone puts a disc in the basket.

- 12 Noon - SECOND ROTATION - Lunch breaks should be staggered or pooled so that events can continue without major delays.
- 1:30 pm - THIRD ROTATION
- 3:00 pm - FOURTH ROTATION - Pick-up Ultimate in the Meadow; other six events continue with Ultimate players "competing" in their Fourth Rotation event first and then breaking for the Ultimate game after their scores are recorded (around 3:30 pm).
- 4:30 pm - FIFTH (last) ROTATION - Each group will have completed 6 events (the first Freestylers will be at the collector's Corner, etc.
- 5:30 pm - 6:00 pm — Dismantle; clean up; remove posters, golf markers, targets, etc.

We have promised the Parks Dept. that we would clean up after our Festival. This undoubtedly will be a big job requiring the greatest possible co-operation. Please encourage everyone to participate in this event and maybe they will "permit" us to come back next year.

- 9:00 pm - Party at Trevor Brown's studio - 49 West 27th St. (just off Sixth Ave.) Room 104 (1st Floor) 532-6514
Refreshments (fruit, cheese, beer, juices) will be served - Free admission to registrants & \$1.00 to guests.

Because the Parks Dept. would not allow the sale of any items in the Park, this is the place to get discs, books, shirts, etc. It's also a great neighborhood for "sky-scraping".

- 8:30 am - 9:00 am — Set up in the Long Meadow in Prospect Park
- Subways are very convenient from Manhattan: 7th Ave IRT #2 or #3 (express) to Grand Army Plaza/Prospect Park Lexington Ave. IRT #4 (express) to same stop
 - D Train (6th Ave. IND express) to Prospect Park/Flatbush Ave. - Walk South along Prospect Park West and enter park at Third St. entrance. Meet near Picnic House in Long Meadow (see map on last page)

- 10:30 am - FIRST ROTATION
12 Noon - SECOND ROTATION
1:30 pm - THIRD ROTATION
3:00 pm - FOURTH ROTATION
4:30 pm - FIFTH (last) ROTATION

- 6:00 pm - AWARDS PRESENTATION - at the Picnic House
Each participant will be awarded an automatic 20 points to be added to their Tournament scores towards the WFC

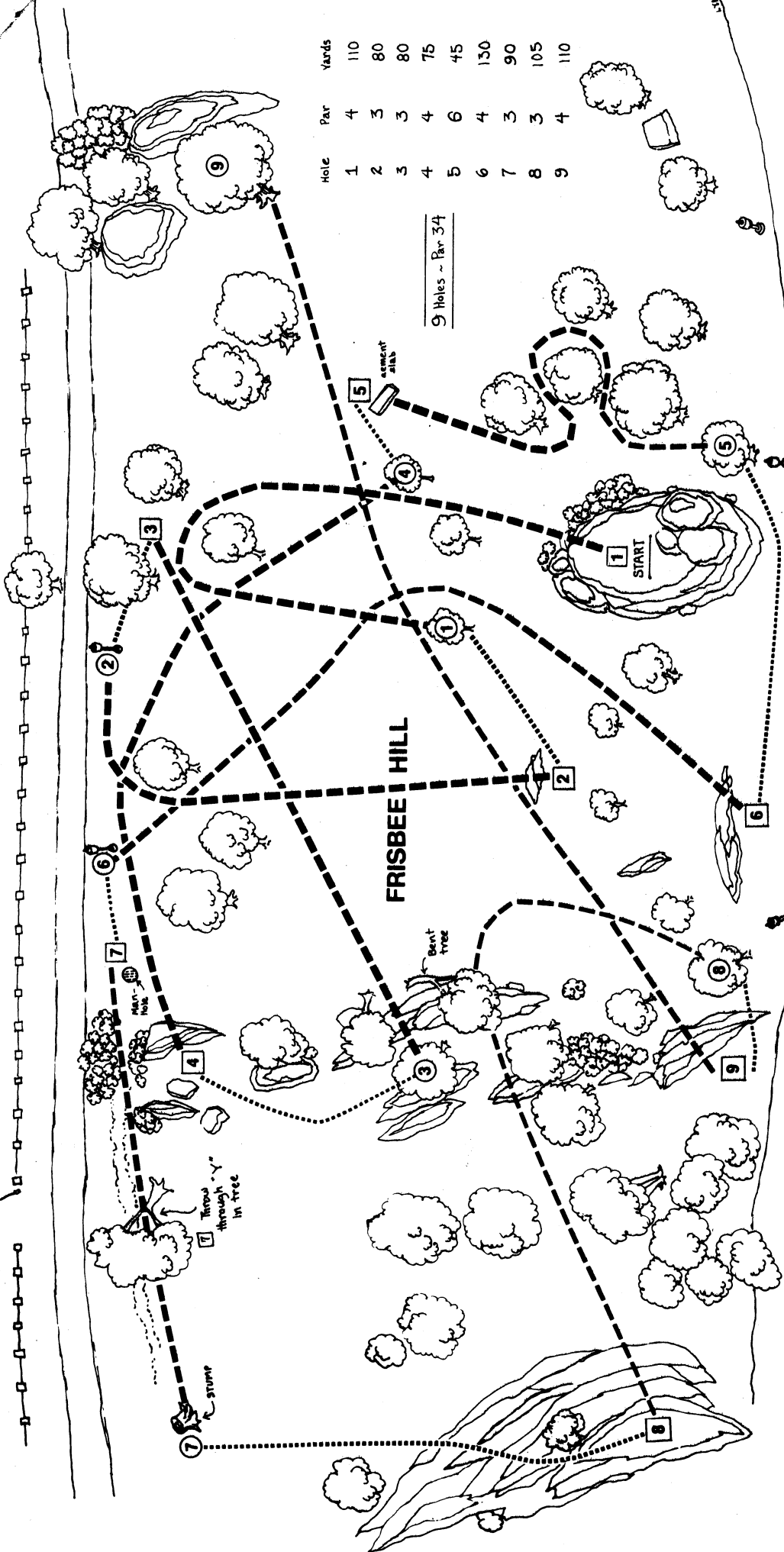


WEST ← 72nd STREET EAST →

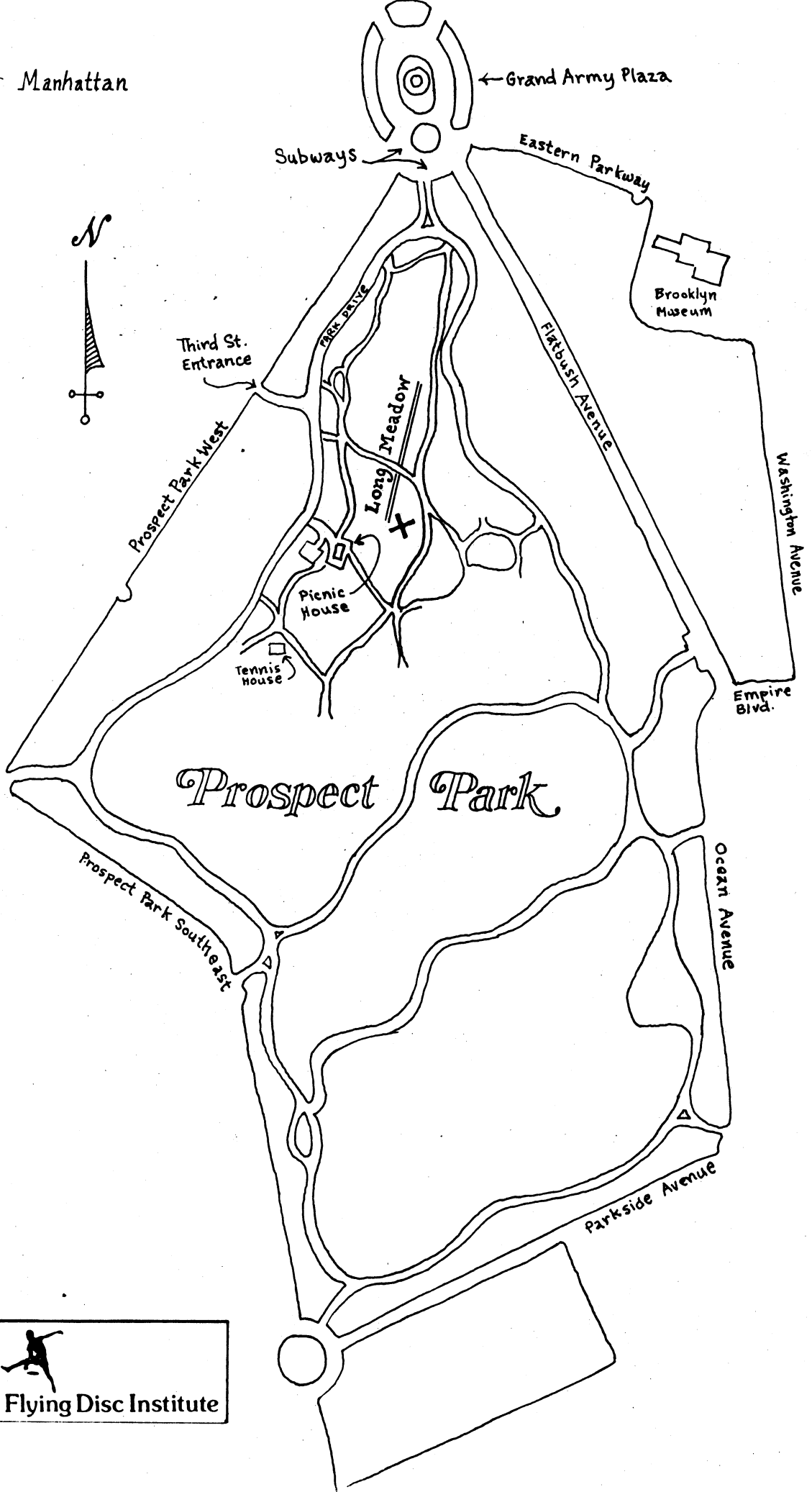

- Why do you suppose there are more than 80,000 members of the International Frisbee Association?
- Do you know why nearly 20,000 enthusiastic fans attended the 1976 World Frisbee Championships at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena?
- Why do you think CBS-TV recently aired 15 minutes of that colorful event on their Sports Spectacular, coast-to-coast, to an audience of millions?

Because Frisbee, the most "popular" sport in the country, is a serious, beautiful, crowd-pleasing spectacle, destined eventually for Olympic competition.

On June 25th & 26th, the New York Flying Disc Institute and the International Frisbee Association will co-sponsor a unique event: "DISC-OVER NEW YORK '77", a Frisbee Festival designed to give the general public the inside story behind "The Fad that Wouldn't Fade".

At DISC-OVER NEW YORK '77, many of the hottest Frisbee pros will mix with some enthusiastic amateurs as well as hundreds of people who enjoy the simple magic of the flying disc. Demonstrations, instructional clinics, competitions, disc collections will all be part of the festivities.

Come and take a shot at a target 75 feet above the Sheep Meadow in Central Park (on Saturday) and the Long Meadow in Prospect Park (on Sunday).

Other all-day activities include: Distance; Accuracy; Maximum Time Aloft; Throw, Run and Catch; Freestyle for Pairs; Ultimate Frisbee; Disc-Golf; Minimum Distance Traveled; Multi-Kick; Double Disc Juggling; Frisbee Films; and more.
