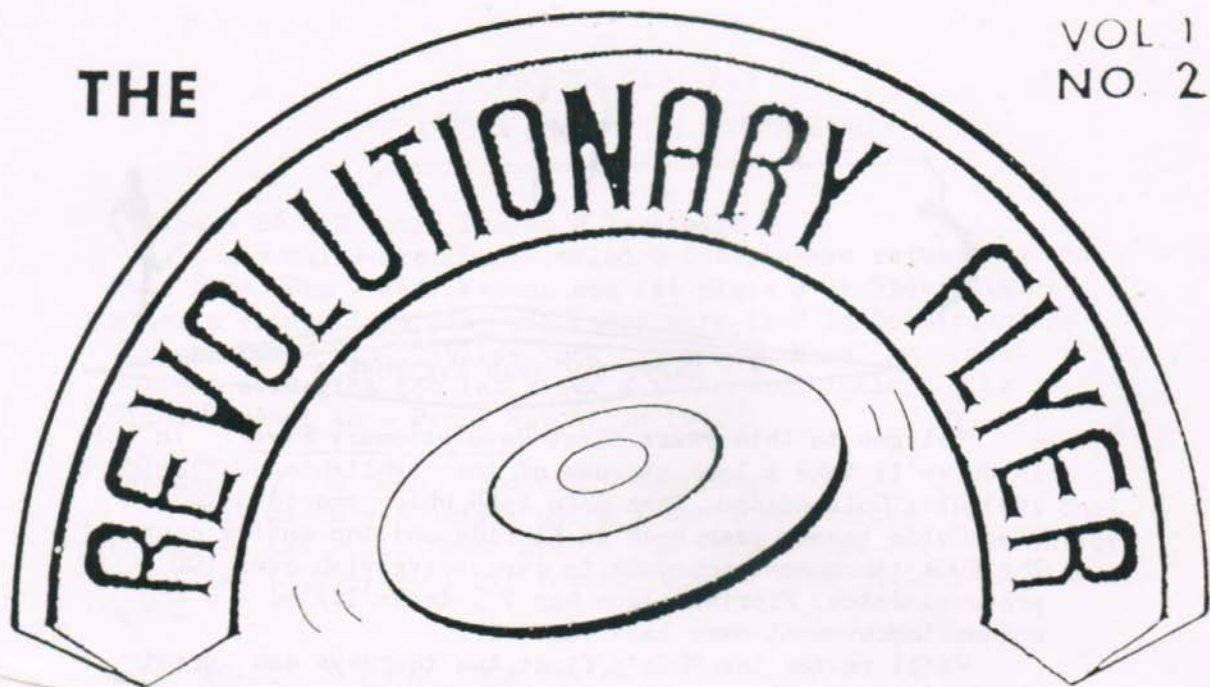

February 26 - 2 round Pro/Am - Rockledge

Heavy rains drenched Rockledge but players refused to wash out. Mens' Pro - Jeff Watson won 1st place over Steve Slasor after a sudden life play off (they were tied in both rounds). Womens' Pro - Cindy Aviles took 1st place. Mens' Am - Bret Segrest struggles for 1st after a tiebreaker against Mike Rice. Womens' Am - Penny Hutchison 1st.

February 27 - 2 round Handicap - Rockledge

This match was unique using a handicap scoring system. The format worked well. Mens' Open - Tim Willis tops Jeff Watson for his first tourney victory. Womens' Open - Penny Hutchison wins again.

March 19-20 - 4 round PDGA Pro/Am - Rockledge

Florida's only PDGA tournament in 1983. Pro players recieved points according to their results which could earn them an invite to the World Disc Golf Championship. Mens' Pro - Steve Slasor won by one throw over a charged up Tim Willis 2nd. Mens' Am - Bret Segrest won comfortably over Mike Rice 2nd and John Andrews 3rd. Womens - Penny Hutchison takes home another 1st place!

May 14-15 - 4round Pro/Am - Rockledge

A very exciting tourney! A great turnout of top rated players. Also Discathon. Mens' Pro - Jeff Watson again slips past Steve Slasor. During a sudden-life tiebreaker JWS sinks an incredible putt on hole #2 to win. Tom Krajna was third. Nick Hart 4th had a hole-in-one on #6. Womens' Pro - Tami Pellicane throwing very well takes 1st and ties womens course record of 58. Mens' Am - Bret Segrest wins third in a row and moves to the pro ranks. Womens' Am - Debbie Notely 1st place. Discathon - this event was great! Nick Hart organized this event which proved to be a grulling test of endurance to most participants and ended with a spectacular finish! Jeff Watson came through first with Nick Hart sliding past Tony Pellicane for 2nd place by just 1/100 of a second! Tami Pellicane won the womens division.

July 10 - 2round Pro/Am - Rockledge

In Rockledges' 5th Anniversary tourney Mens' Pro Steve Slasor earns top spot over Gregg Hosfeld 2nd, Jeff Watson 3rd. Womens Pro - Lori Byrne wins over Deanna Kirk in a close match. Mens' Am - John Andrews tops Mike Rice for his first victory during a very competitive Am - Division. Womens' Am - Roxanne Spencer upsets Penny Hutchison for 1st place.

September 10-11 - 4round Pro/Am - Rockledge

Florida State D-G Championship tourney. This event was surely the tourney of the year. A large turnout, beautiful course and weather conditions, record breaking scores, upset victories -- all the makings of a top-notch contest! Also new super discs were introduced which added a new dimension. Mens' Pro - Jeff Watson won 1st by just one throw over Steve Slasor with record breaking scores 186,187. Tim Willis earned 3rd. Also Gregg Hosfeld cranked a record breaking 42 beating the previous record 45. Jeff Watson also tied that record 42 later. Womens' Pro - Tami Pellicane won 1st place after throwing an incredible record setting 49 in the 2nd round. Mens' Am Bill Gallo's 1st place victory surprised the Am division. Upsetting top rated Amateurs John Andrews 2nd and Mike Rice 3rd. Bill also broke 2 Amateur records, a 52 round and a 4 round 220. Womens' Am - Roxanne Spencer won comfortably and set a new 4 round record of 293.

October 15-16 - 4round Pro/Am - Discmasters' Altamonte Springs

A landmark tourney bringing disc golf to the Orlando area and inspiring other players to hold tourneys on temporary courses. Offering golfers a new and different course setting also broke ground for developing future interests in Central Florida. Held at a 9 hole course used by a few local players it proved to be a challenging course. Using portable pole holes and a new type of ground basket the tourney worked well. Mens' Pro - Steve Slasor 1st, Gregg Hosfeld 2nd, and Nick Hart 3rd. Mens' Am - Mike Rice Wins, John Andrews 2nd, and Craig Barrero 3rd. Womens' - Debbie Notely 1st. Juniors' - Steve Berry 1st, and Patrick Berry 2nd - Watch These Young Fellows!

This was my first tournament and had a few problems, but all-in-all I was pleased and expect to host more!

November 26 - 2round Pro/Am - Rockledge

Mens' Pro - Steve Slasor wins again, John David 2nd, and Gary Bancroft 3rd. Womens' Pro - Lori Byrne squeezed out a win over Deanna Kirk by just one throw. Mens' Am - John Andrews takes 1st also sets a record low 49. Mike Rice 2nd. Womens Am - Roxanne Spencer 1st place and record low 64. Newcomer Denise Monroe 2nd.

November 27 - 2round Doubles Scamble - Rockledge

A doubles tournament in which only light plastic (World Class 119gm) discs' could be used. Also, both partners tee off then choose their best drive. From there regular play resumes combining the scores.

1st - Nick Hart / Dave Thompson

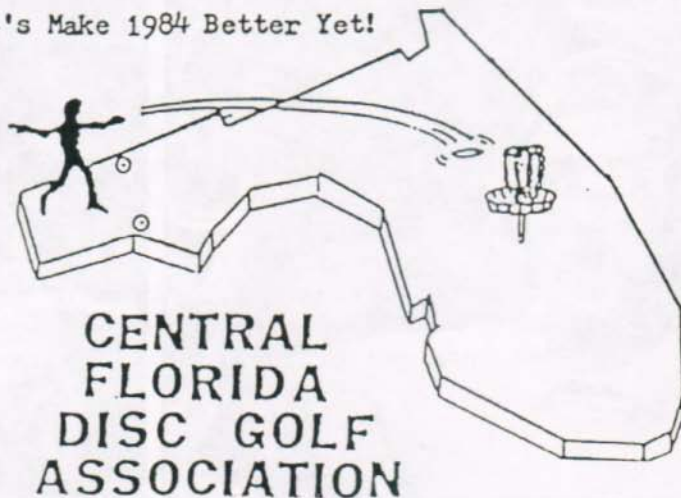
2nd - Steve Slasor / Steve Edney

## Steve Slasor Ready - Tops Jeff Watson in PDGA Opener!

The 1984 Pro Disc Golf season is underway in Florida. The opening tournament was held at Loch Haven Park in Orlando, January 14th & 15th. This tourney was the first of seven scheduled PDGA (Professional Disc Golf Association) events in the state. These events are part of a world-wide pro tour schedule that will determine who will qualify for the World Championships later this year.

The competition is tough. Four of Florida's players are rated in the top five of the world. They include:  
Jeff Watson, Sarasota - 1983 World Disc Golf Champion  
1983 World Overall Champion  
1983 Florida Disc Golf Champion

Tom Monroe, Gainesville - #2 World Disc Golfer  
Tom Krajna, Sarasota - #4 World Disc Golfer  
Steve Slasor, Palm Bay - #5 World Disc Golfer

Florida has other top rated professionals whose talents are well respected and many more future contenders getting involved as the sport continues to grow.

Now let's take a look at Loch Haven's high points and results. Despite ugly weather conditions, the tournaments' attendance was good. 23 men pros, 3 women pros, and 15 men amateurs. The course was set up just for this event - there isn't a permanent pole hole course in Orlando yet. Local pros Tommy Stanford, Marshall Scribner, and Mike Rice did a fine job designing the course and other players brought their portable holes to insure a 'state of the sport' setting. Thanks guys!

Massive Live Oak trees demanded using a variety of throwing skills, especially the rollers. Other features were mandatory obstacles and a lot of out of bounds areas. Everyone seemed to enjoy playing a new course and Loch Haven is truly a beautiful atmosphere.

Saturdays play ended with Steve Slasor one throw ahead of Jeff Watson after 36 holes. Denise Monroe leading the womens pro division by 4 throws ahead of Roxanne Spencer. David Smith, a new player, had a commanding 5 throw lead in the mens amateur division.

Sunday started out like Saturday with weather conditions gloomy and cool, but the players had a better feel of the course. After the 3rd round was completed the standings were: Steve Slasor and Jeff Watson TIED for first in mens pro after Watson set a course record of 50. Jim Herrich cranked a 50 also and was in third place. Denise Monroe still out front by 6. David Smith still holding a good lead.

In the final round Slasor pulled away from Watson and claims the #1 spot in the season opener. If you happened to see Steve's incredible roller off the 18th tee that ended up right at the hole you know that he is in top form. As for Jeff you can bet he'll be back.

Third place showed a 3 way tie- Nick Hart, Bart Woodard, and Joel Cacharelis. The play off for 3rd-5th was a very exciting event. Beginning on hole #15 the players gave their best. Joel who was a visiting folfier from Chicago, after a low approach shot just missed a long putt and was out of the race. Nick and Bart had 3's. On hole #16 both drives were almost in the same place, Bart slightly closer. About 40 feet away Nick throws a perfect putt right in. So the pressure was on Bart. A must situation facing a 40 footer Bart does make a nice shot, but it bounces off the basket and that was it, Nick takes 3rd.

Denise Monroe stayed out front and took 1st in womens Pro, but not without a fight from Roxanne Spencer. Sandra Schrock placed 3rd.

In mens Am. David Smith remained in control to win his first tournament. Mark McKinney was 2nd down by 11 throws.

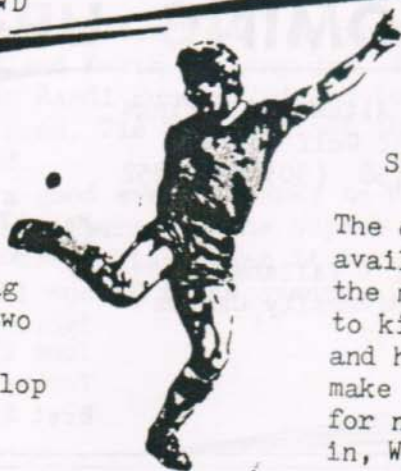

## GOLFING AT THE GROVE

The second stop on the PDGA tour in Florida was February 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> at David Kennedy Park, Coconut Grove. Located just south of Miami, the course sets right on the shore of Biscayne Bay.

Bob McCormick coordinated the contest which was played on a permanent 9 hole course with 9 more holes set up specially for the tourney. The front nine was a bit shorter than the back nine, but required precise drives thru the trees. Bob designed the back nine, which had a higher degree of difficulty. Overall a very challenging course.

Starting out on Saturday the weather conditions were perfect with sunny skies and a warm temperature in the high 70's. In all 44 players turned out for a good show of 18 men pros, 15 men amateurs, 3 women amateurs, and 3 juniors. Most of the pro players are from other areas of the state and had to react quickly to meet the demands of this new and very different layout.

The results after round one were surprising. Great rounds by the southpaw Tim Willis who cranked a 50, and Marshall Scribner with an outstanding 51 led the field of the mens pro division. Larry Bradshaw was just ahead of Dave Lauderback by one throw in the mens amateur division.

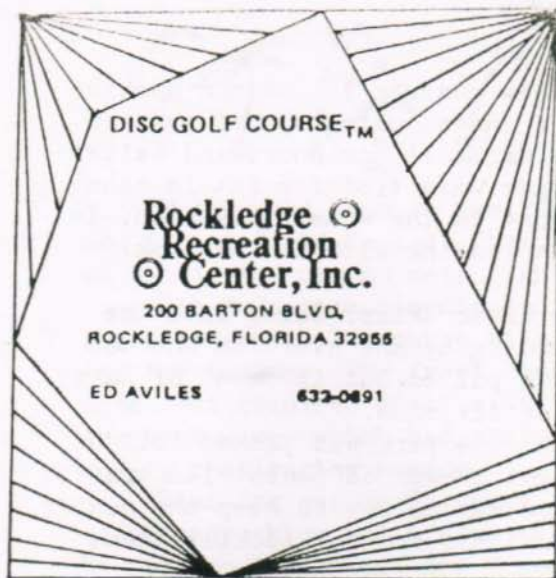
Sunday's play was again under clear skies. Going into the final round it was Steve Slasor leading by one over Tim who was one up on Nick Hart. Dave Lauderback pulled out in front of Larry by 3. Tim took control of the junior division.

At the start of the final round the park was packed full of people. The beautiful weather brought crowds of pedestrian traffic which caused several problems. There was no way to keep the course clear, so players had to throw around the crowds. Luckily there were no reported assaults.

Steve and Nick finished tied for 1st at 205. Tim Willis dropped to 3rd and John David was 4th. Being tied forced Steve and Nick into a play off situation. Starting at hole #1 they both threw birdies. On hole #2 Nick drove to about 40 feet away from the basket and Steve about 20 feet away. The suspense grew while Nick was sizing up his demanding putt. He throws slightly high and lands on top of the hole but not in. A very unusual situation. Steve also facing a difficult putt sinks it and takes 1st place. This was Steve's second victory of the year while Nick had to settle for a very close second.

In the mens amateur division Dave Lauderback holds onto 1st with Larry Bradshaw 2nd and Kevin Bogusky 3rd. Jane Combs dominates the womens division over Randi Poretz 2nd and Lori Notley 3rd. Junior competition was good, Tim Klimoski out throws John Murphy 2nd and Kevin Notley 3rd.

All-in-all it was a good event. Thanks to Bob McCormick, Debbie Notley, and their helpers for the superb job they did running this tourney. It should be realized that it takes a lot of time, energy, and money to pull one of these events off, and they did a great job. Good Going Gang!

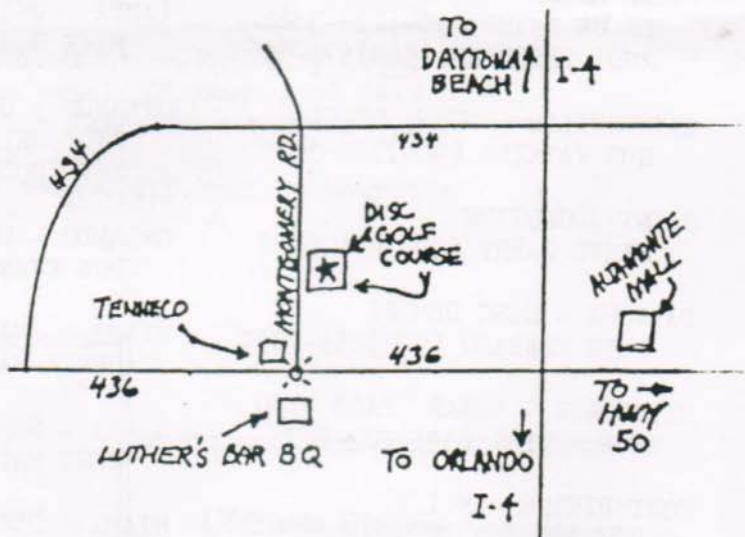
