

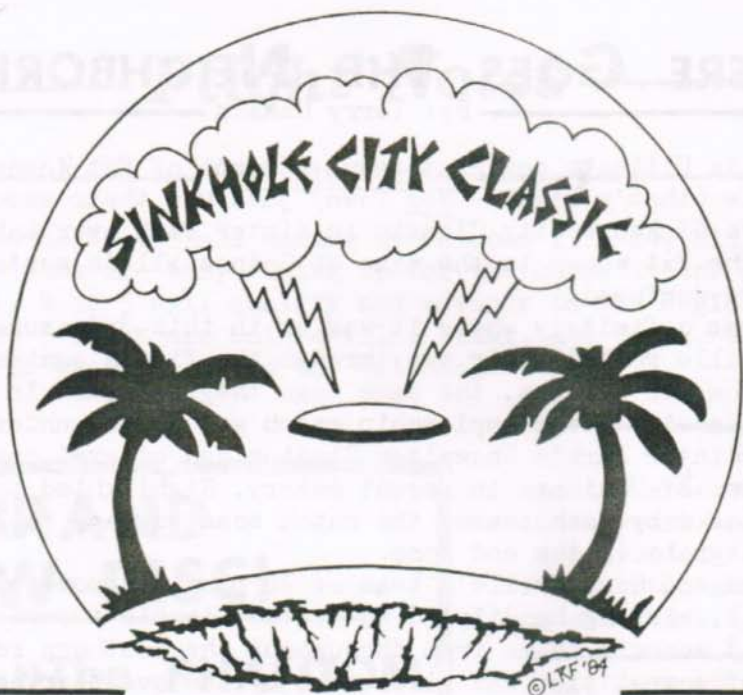

Thirty days hath September, but two of them are reserved for one of the largest Ultimate tournaments in Florida - The Sinkhole City Classic played at Showalter Stadium in Winter Park. Sinkhole '84 featured 12 teams in the men's division and 3 women's teams. Both Gainesville teams made a clean sweep by winning in both divisions. Other teams traveled from Atlanta, Oak Ridge, Tenn., and Huntsville, Ala. to play. Finals, which were played under the lights, featured some great defensive plays by Gainesville and their opponents, Gang of Disc. Final score 18 to 9.

In semi-final action Miami edged by USF, 17-15, while the wild card UCF lost to Gang of Disc.

Another aspect of the Sinkhole is its poolside party and BBQ. The honorably discharged William St. John and his roommate Jay "this must be the place" Boland provided a sumptuous spread that everyone hungrily and quickly devoured. Protein loading as it's called in some circles.

This third Sinkhole brought home the idea that all Florida teams are becoming stronger and much more competitive. Sectionals, scheduled for Oct. 13th and 14th in Gainesville, are certain to feature some very fine play if Sinkhole '84 is any indication.

THERE GOES THE NEIGHBORHOOD

What is Ultimate coming to now? A bunch of Fat Women from Gainesville (that's right - Hog Town) just won their second consecutive Sinkhole City Classic in Winter Park over Labor Day weekend. The Fat Women is the name of Gainesville's men's team in case you're confused.

Fat was definitely where it was at in this 3rd annual tourney as Gainesville rolled their way through the finals against Gang of Disc from New Orleans, the same team they defeated in last years Sinkhole Classic. The championship match was played under the lights in Winter Park's Showalter Stadium and offered one of the better views of Ultimate in recent memory. Highlighted by wide open aerial attacks by both teams, the match boasted many fully-extended horizontal grabs in the end zone.

In the end Gainesville's team of 20 plus overpowered G.O.D.'s squad of 14, winning handily 18 to 9. The Classic turned out 12 men's and 3 women's teams from throughout the southern region. The two days of competition was victimized by the overbearing heat and humidity which has become associated with this late summer tourney. Despite conditions, strong showings were made by Miami, Atlanta, Tampa and the host Aliens from Orlando. The Dogs of War from UCF battled back from the losers bracket to play G.O.D. in the semi-finals as a wild card. Gainesville's women's team, The Flying Nuns, took 1st place in women's competition with impressively solid offensive and defensive play.

What is Ultimate?

Ultimate is one of the fastest-growing and most exciting team sports in America today. It blends physical intensity, endurance, and grace with a sense of comraderie to produce a truly unique competitive sport. Ultimate is played with two seven-person teams. The players advance a flying disc up a feild (70 yards long and 40 yards wide) by passing it to their teammates while the defensive players attempt to block or intercept passes. Play is continuous, and any incomplete pass or interception results in an immediate change of possession. A point is scored when a pass is completed in an endzone. Ultimate is a sport that has a great deal of appeal for players of all levels of ability. It is becoming increasingly popular in school athletic programs and P.E. classes; thousands of men and women around the world are playing on organized teams. The sport has developed competitive levels which are exciting to watch as well as play, and is now attracting increasing spectator and media attention.

Ultimate Update

With the Sectionals coming up October 13 & 14, Florida's Ultimate teams are busy tuning up for the competition. Out of 10 teams only 4 or 5 will qualify and advance to the Regionals. The R.F.'s top 3 picks are Gainesville, Miami, and Tampa. The real question is who will go to the Nationals?

Disc Golf

The disappointment of the year has been the absence of Jeff Watson. Has he gone into semi-retirement? Last years World & State golf champion failed to compete in this years events. We've been told that he is up to his frisbee elbow in T-shirts, and has been recovering from an Ultimate injury. Will he come back in '85?

The University of Central Florida has set up a 18 hole object course on campus with plans to install pole holes in the future.

Tami Pellicane is at it again - winning Frisbee tournaments that is! At the '84 Mazda US Open in LaMirada, California, Tami took 1st in golf, discathon, and distance events and placed 2nd overall for the second consecutive year. About a month later she earned 1st place overall at the World Flying Disc Championships in Santa Cruz, California. Tami was 1st in golf, MTA, DDC, and won distance with a record breaking 347.05' throw. The old record of 338'3½" was set by Tami last year.

Being a student at the University of Florida in Gainesville, Tami must be spending all of her spare spinning that disc. Great going Tami, you are an inspiration to women athletes everywhere!

1984 World Disc Golf Championships
Held in Rochester, NY

The 1984 version of the World Disc Golf Championship Tournament was held from July 26-29th in the beautiful city of Rochester, New York. Tournament Director Jim Palmeri drew on his many years of organization skills by combining the WDGC with his 10 year old American Flying Disc (AFDO) series and produced an excellent event by any standards.

Virtually all of the Professional Disc Golf Association hoi poloi attended with the notable exception of 1983 world champion Jeff Watson who reputedly stayed in Florida nursing a serious injury. Among the 1984 PDGA participants this year were many of the long-standing greats of the sport as a glance at the final standings will attest. The godfather of the game, Steady Ed Headrick, was on hand, and to mark the occasion a new travelling trophy was introduced this year to honor the outstanding player on the tour. This year that honor justifiably went to John David who accumulated well over 100 qualification points toward the championships. Eight points were needed to be invited this year!

The 1984 WDGC marked a major milestone in the development of the PDGA as Steady Ed passed the gavel of director to Ted Saethers of Little Rock, Arkansas. Ted received an extended ovation from the players at the meeting preceding the tourney as he announced his staff and plans for the 1985 tour.

The event drew players from the U.S., Canada, and Sweden. In all there were 141 open, 25 women's, 15 master's, 1 grand master, and 2 senior grand master division entrants this year.

The surprise of the weekend had to be the triumph of 16-year-old Sam Ferrans from La Mirada, California in the open division! The previous weekend he had won the La Mirada tournament; and to verify that that victory was no fluke, the young whiz smoked the old pros by 5 shots overall. During the final 18 played on the longer of the two courses set up specially for this tournament, Sam appeared to be the calmest person on the course which included a gallery of most of the rest of the pros, most of the AFDO participants, countless

townspeople, and assorted cameras, tv crews, helicopters, barking dogs, and abandoned children. But no effects of these myriad distractions showed outwardly from the relaxed champion as he set about playing one of the steadiest rounds of the tournament. None of the other three members of the foursome--Johnny Sias, David Greenwell, or Tom Monroe--could mount a run against The Kid.

In the women's division Marie Jackson from Milwaukee, Wisconsin became the two-time consecutive champion by coasting to a six stroke victory. Mounting a charge that was too late to win it all, but good enough for second place was perennial all-round women's world champion, Judy Horowitz from New York City. Also breaking the 290 barrier were Vanessa Chambers from South Carolina in 3rd and newcooser Ramona Hale from Norman, Oklahoma in 4th.

Steve Slaor ran off and hid in the master's division by fashioning a 244 first place total for a six-stroke advantage over second place Captain Snap. Steve totalled 243 in the open division which also earned him seventh place. Tom Monroe also doubled in open and master's play. His 252 was good enough for third place in the master's division to go with his fourth place open finish at 239.

Jim Olson, Sr., the lone entrant in the grand master division, shot an excellent 216 total which included a seven under par 48 in his semi-final round. Using a highly effective sidearm roller and one of the finest contorted putting styles ever attempted, Jim reached most holes easily and then coaxed a birdie by putting out of the middle of several thick evergreen trees!

In the battle of the titans Jack Roddick and Steady Ed Headrick (the father of Stork and the father of disc golf respectively) went head to head for three grueling rounds. When the dust had settled and the blood was cleaned up, the two gladiators stood at 178 each. In a fit ending it was decided that they both should get the gold.



Next year there will be two world tournaments: one in Tulsa, Oklahoma and one in Gotteborg, Sweden. The complete 1984 WDGC results were as follows:

1984 FLORIDA STATE DISC GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

Devastating tropical storm Diana could not deter 53 dedicated disc golfers who arrived from all over the southeast this past weekend to compete in the '84 Florida State Invitational Disc Golf Championships in Rockledge. Saturday's heavy rains (torrential at times) and flooded conditions seemed to adversely affect some players more than others producing unexpected results with John David and Walter Reynolds failing to make the cut in the heavily talented Men's pro division. The day's play was highlighted by leader Gregg Hosfeld of Orlando's 46 and the first ace ever, on the 273 foot par 4 ninth hole by Sarasota's Tim Willis, both in the 2nd round.

Sunday's lack of rain allowed Steve Slasor of Palm Bay to mount a charge at the leaders, but Gregg held on to win. Tom Krajna of Sarasota had 3 rounds in the 40's which were good for 2nd. Roxanne Spencer of Melbourne tied Tami Pellicane's 4-round course record of 238 to take the women's pro, and Orlando newcomer Nancy Nance led the women's amateurs. The men's amateur division was hot and after 4 rounds a sudden-life play-off was required to break a 3-way tie for 1st. North Miami's Larry Bradshaw, on the occasion of his 24th birthday gave himself a present by edging Hialeah's Bobby McCormick and Maitland's teen-age marvel, Steve Berry II, for the Amateur title. Southern Florida's powerful presence was accentuated by North Miami's Kevin Bogusky's ace on the 172 foot, par 3, 8th hole.

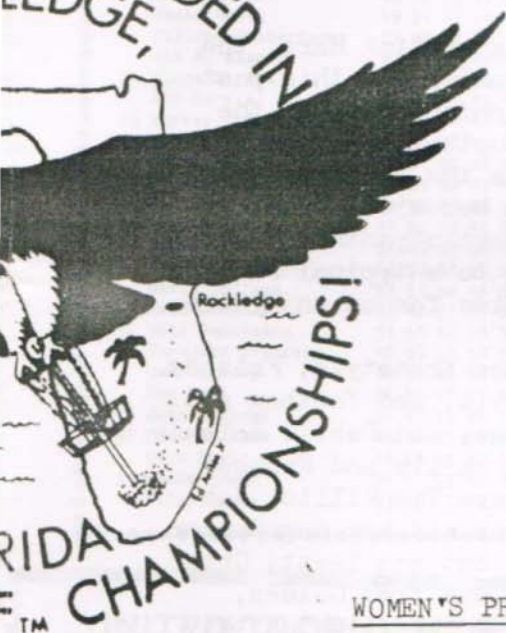

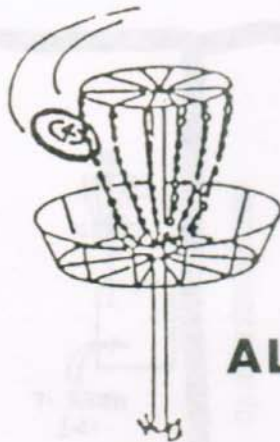

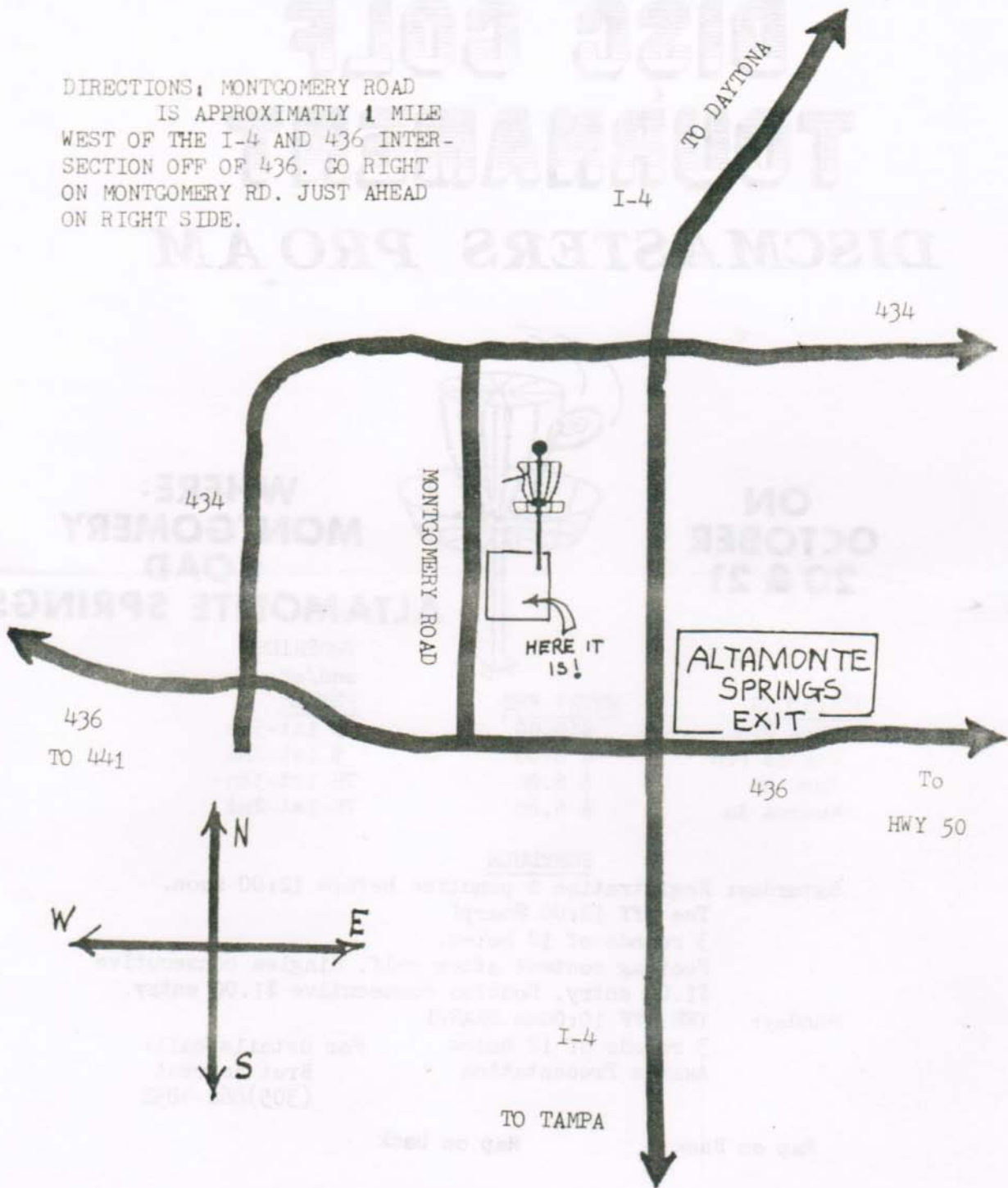

The 1984 World Footbag Association (WFA) National Footbag Championships were held in Boulder, Colorado on August 15th through 19th. Over one hundred competitors came from near and far to beautiful Boulder for the 2nd annual holding of the prestigious event.

Boasting total prize monies of \$7,500, the WFA tournament directors' Greg Cortopassi & Bruce Guettich's hard work and determination paid off. This highly successful tourney, did indeed, bring out the very best players and the largest field of competitors ever. The results, due to the lack of any competitors from Florida or the Southeast, probably would be of little interest to the R.F. readers. Basically there were strong finishes by players from Oregon, Colorado, California, Denmark, Texas, the Northeast, & the Midwest.

So, the time is now to practice up for future competition. **FLORIDA GET KICKING!** For learning the basic kicks and developing advanced moves, contact Bret & Dori Segrest, certified instructors and representatives for the W.F.A. Hey, hey, what do you say? **WFA ALL THE WAY!**



Three Major Basic Kicks

FLAT KICK: This kick is used when the footbag falls low and directly between both shoulders. The inside of the foot is used by turning the instep and ankle up to create a flat striking surface. Contact with the footbag is made around knee level.
*Special Note: Try curling your toes under to aid in creating a flat surface.



Two Minor Basic Kicks

KNEE KICK: This kick is used to prevent the footbag from striking the midsection of the body. The top portion of the thigh is used by bending the knee and lifting straight up to block the footbag upwards. This kick is merely a set for one of the more reliable 3 major kicks.

*Special Note: For best results do not attempt to use this kick if the footbag is crossing your body, but instead when it approaches directly in front of you.



OUTSIDE KICK: This kick is used when the footbag falls to the outside of either shoulder. The outside of the foot is used by turning the ankle and knee out to create a flat striking surface. With kicking foot now parallel to playing surface, use a smooth lifting motion, striking footbag at approximately knee level.

*Special Note: Try pointing your toes up to aid in creating a flat surface.

TOE KICK: This kick is used when the footbag is going over your head or is directly approaching your upper chest. The hips and upper body must rotate parallel to the direction of the footbag's flight to enable the footbag to pass and still maintain constant eye contact. Lean forward in the direction of footbag's flight and allow footbag to pass by before executing kick.

*Special Note: Contact point on the foot is the same as that of an outside kick.



TOE KICK: This kick provides a quick reach to save or cover when the other four basic kicks cannot be used. The top part of the foot on the toes is used by flicking toes straight up and contacting the footbag low/directly out in front.
