1994 Commonwealth Games Preliminary Information

The Virginia Commonwealth Games is once again being scheduled this year, and the RFDA has again been invited to host the Ultimate Competition and the Disc Golf Competition. The dates for the Commonwealth Games are July 15-17, 1994. The Ultimate Competition will be held on Saturday, July 16th and the Disc Golf on Sunday, July 17th. The Opening Ceremonies will be held the evening of Friday, July 15th, and the Games Cookout will be held the Saturday evening.

We anticipate the costs for entering the competitions to remain the same this year. Preliminary Entry Fees will be \$20.00 per person for the Ultimate Competition and \$25.00 per person for the Disc Golf.

Players packages have not been set yet, but as last year, we expect participants will receive lots of good stuff. Virginia Amateur Sports Inc., the organization that coordinates the Commonwealth Games, is still waiting to hear word on a piece of legislation that could affect the Commonwealth Games, but hope are that the piece of legislation will not pass and work can

I have been hearing some disturbing things about the Roanoke City Parks and Rec. Department, Spring Ultimate, and the RFDA. First it seems there is some sort of dissention among some of the Ultimate players about the

RFDA being a sponsor of last years Summer Ultimate League. It seems these players (who, I don't know exactly) don't like our involvement in the league. I've got one question. Just what did we do? We and our contacts with the Parks and Rec. got the league started, gave them the rules, gave them our contacts and our support. Beyond that all that we did was supply some of our members. What's the problem? Have ego's been assaulted? Do they hate our members? What? To this date no one has offered a reasonable explanation. The RFDA is directly and mostly responsible for a Disc Golf course and a Summer Ultimate league, What have they done? How many holes did they supply? What, besides providing their warm bodies, did they do for last years Ultimate league? And more important just who are THEY? I challenge whoever THEY are to speak out either in an open letter, at a club meeting or to me in person and tell me just what it is they don't like. Quit going behind the clubs back and tell it to our face? I am tired of being in the middle just hearing rumors. I want facts. I didn't have any major problems with the Ultimate league last year. The only problem I had last year was there were times when it seemed like only two or three people on the team were playing. I saw time and time again players wide open and not getting the disc, the other players some times threw into a crowd or tight coverage instead of to the open player. This situation seemed to resolve itself by the end of the season. Once again league play is being scheduled for Monday and Wednesday nights. The way I understand it the first hour Mondays will be used as a training time with a pickup game being played during the second hour, and league play will be on Wednesdays if this is true this will probably eliminate me from participating this year. Wednesdays during the summer are free for me but until June my Wednesday nights are full. This saddens me because I was looking forward to playing this year. The Park and Rec. have said they are neutral in this argument, but several steps they have taken don't bear this out. First they have dropped the RFDA as a sponsor, second the scheduling seems to reflect the wishes of several people in the past who have been critical of the RFDA. It really troubles me that politics and petty dislikes have colored a fun sport and

ICE BOWL 5

WE FINALLY GET A REAL ICE BOWL

It was Ice Bowl 5. It was cold, but it was sunny. The ground was hard, but it was soft. Basically, it was just about everything at Fishburn Park on Saturday, January 22nd, 1994. We definitely had an Ice Bowl this year. Most of the park was covered by a solid sheet of ice by the Tee Off Time of 12 Noon. The hopes of the tournament staff was that everyone would use caution and have fun. That did indeed happen and we escaped the Ice Bowl with only a minor cut from a fall. The field totalled 26 for the shotgun start for Ice Bowl 5. We had 8 in the Amateur Division, 5 in the Advanced Division, 11 in the Open Division, and 2 in the Womens Division. The course setup was with the front nine played standard, and the portable back nine played short to avoid more treacherous areas of the park. This also allowed players to bone up on their short game. The scores were low due to the short back nine and the fact that when your throw would land, it would sometimes slide as far as you threw it. At the end of Round One, Gary Kraterfield led the Amateur Division by 6 strokes with a 62. David LeMaire held second with a 68 and David Gregg was third with a 71. In the Advanced Division, Erich Mauer shot a first round 58 to hold a one stroke lead over Dorsey "Monster Arm" Taylor with a 59. Don Wetzel was holding third with an uncharacteristic 63. In the Womens Division, Carleen Overacker shot an 82 and Lisa Miller was 6 strokes back with an 88. In the Open Division, Scott Bowman and Rusty Wilhelm were tied for first with 53, with Gary Foster, Kevin Morris, and Chris DeSalvo at 56. The scores were not too bad considering the conditions, but the short back nine helped to keep them low. After a short break to feed face and warm feet, Round 2 began. What a mess the course was turning out to be. The ice started melting in areas receiving sunlight, and this compounded the prevalent water drainage problem that we still have in the park, so, needless to say, we had our fair share of COLD! standing water and MUD!. Round two was basically free of major happenings except on Hole #17 when Kevin Morris shot a Hole In One to take the Ace Pool. I am not too sure of the distance of Hole #17, but I would guess it to be around 220 Ft. Congratulations Kevin. Nice shot. Now if you could yell a little louder when you ace, you could be classed with the noise of a Rusty Wilhelm ace. The Womens Division didn't change as both Carleen and Lisa improved their scores and shot a 78. Carleen took first and Lisa took second. In The Amateur Division, leader Gary Kraterfield shot a 63 in the second round, but David LeMaire shot a 57 and made up his 6 stroke deficit from the first round to tie Gary for first and force a playoff. David Gregg held solid for a third place finish. In the Advanced Division, Erich Mauer shot a 56 to

go with his first round 58 and take first place. Dorsey Taylor shot a 61, but still managed to hold second place even though he had slipped to 6 strokes back. Don Wetzel was clearly not having one of his good days, but he held third place with a second round to match his first round of 63. In the Open Division, Kevin Morris did what he seems to do best, which is to come from behind with smokin' second rounds. Kevin Morris shot a blistering 47 to take first place. Maybe it wasn't the sun melting the ice after all.....Maybe it was Kevin???? Although Rusty Wilhelm bettered his first round by one stroke to shoot a 52, it wasn't quite enough to match Kevin's second round play. Rusty finished second two strokes back from Kevin Morris with a 105. Doug DeSalvo came from back in the pack to take third with a second round score of 51. What makes this score special is that he shot a 21 on the front nine. That is a course record, besting the previous record of yours truly, Michael Overacker, with a 22. Drats, I was hoping that score would hold for a while, but alas, congratulations must go to Doug for a fine front nine. Doug finished with a 110, seven strokes back from the leader. In the Amateur Division Playoff between Gary Kraterfield and David LeMaire, The tied hole #1 and teed off for Hole #2. Gary threw a short but accurate hyzer to skirt the brush and swamp and was sitting about 40 ft short of the hole. David LeMaire set up and threw, but he pulled his shot and released high. He disc flattened and sailed over the creek for a 1 stroke penalty. David was still away, but had to sink a third shot of about 80 feet to force Gary's game. David's shot was close, but not enough as Gary parred the second hole and won the Amateur Division. Thanks to all those that helped put on this event, and thanks to Karen Brooks and Michelle Tickle for remembering my Birthday which was the same day as the Ice Bowl. The card, gift, and Birthday Cookie were great. Karen, thanks for showing up even with a recently broken wrist. That is the sign of a real disc enthusiast, a good club member, and a great friend. I just can't wait for the warm weather to come again.
