Section III Regional Report

If you were wondering why this circular has been so long overdue, it is because we were waiting for a report on the Regional Tournament held in New Orleans over two weeks ago. Evidently Atlanta and Mobile did not win or they would have called or written by now.

Regardless of who will represent the South in Atlanta, the tournament is shaping up as the biggest wintertime disc gathering ever. Dan (the Stork) Roddick will be there as will Jim Palmeri and other notable figures in the Flying Disc World.

Even if you only go for one afternoon it will be worth the drive, especially if you need some playing stock or some collectables.

Second Annual Cedars Tournament

Cedars of Lebanon State Park had its second fall tournament in mixed weather on October 25 & 26. Dave Greenwell, winner here last spring, had to finish strong to tie for 3rd with Stuart Arnold, also a Kentuckian. They edged Steve Hardie of Nashville and Rocky Johnson of Sewanee out of the money by one stroke in the final round. Bob Elliott, course pro at Otter Creek, held second place throughout the four rounds and finished 4 strokes up on third. Finishing second in both previous tournaments here, Ken Folger took first this time on the strength of two 49's the first day. This gave him the five stroke margin he ended with, totaling 201. Pros earned \$75, \$38, \$22, and \$15 through fourth place.

There were many prizes and much participation in several divisions, so the rewards were well spread. Hopefully, if next fall's tournament is scheduled for warmer weather and fewer conflicts with other frisbee events, this fine disc golf course can get the widespread appreciation it deserves.

Ultimate Frisbee National Championship November 28, 29 and 30

The Atlanta Frisbee Club and Georgia Tech are proud to announce that the 5th Annual Ultimate Frisbee National Championship will be held this year at Georgia Tech's Landis Field on Nov. 28, 29 and 30. Ultimate Frisbee is currently being played by more than 450 teams (over 100,000) (people) nationwide, and it is the fastest growing team sport in the U.S. Fast moving and non-contact by design, Ultimate Frisbee combines the continuous action of soccer with the high scoring of basketball to create the country's first truly unique field sport since the invention of football 100 years ago.

Of the 450 teams nationwide, only the top 5 will be coming to Atlanta to determine this year's Ultimate Frisbee Champion — an honor that will include a nice trophy and a good deal of money.

The final game will be Sunday afternoon — don't miss it.
