The stated purpose of the Federation is to advance physical and mental fitness through flying disc sports and recreation. What this means for you personally is accelerated growth for all individual player's associations, greater media awareness of disc activities, further education of the public at all levels on the value of our games, better scheduling co-ordination of disc events, and a better position on which to gain corporate and governmental support.

If you are a member of any player's association, you are automatically a member of the Federation. A temporary board of directors was voted on in Atlanta, with representatives from all player's groups and members pursuing specific tasks.

The W.F.D.F. will be seeking non profit status. All financial or other help from various disc manufacturers will gladly be accepted. Autonomy will be at forefront always.

If everyone helps out, goes to tournaments, and increases the public awareness, this will surely be the **Decade of the Disc**.

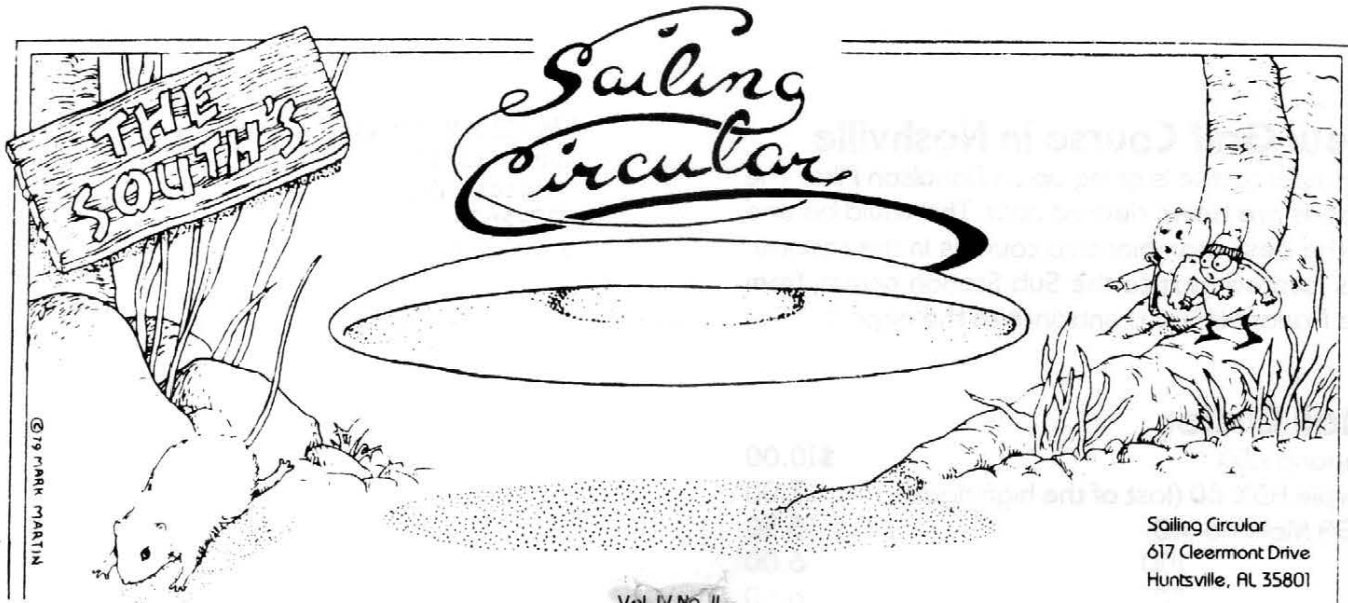
Indoor Festival - ~~Cancelled~~

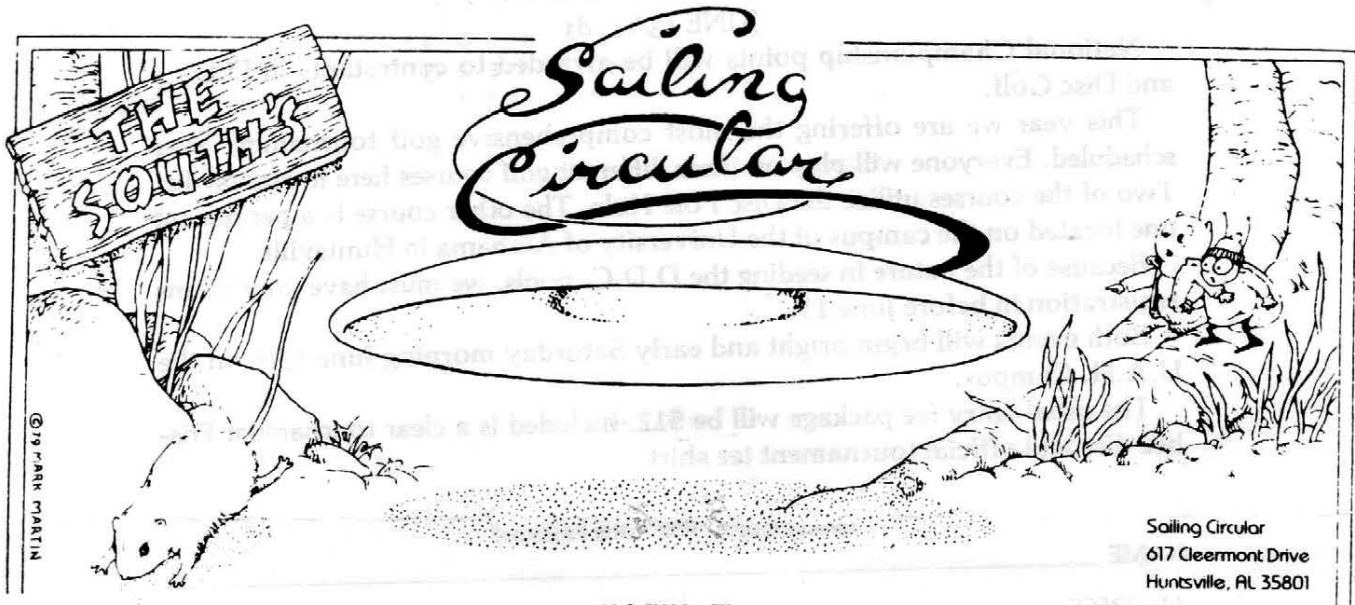

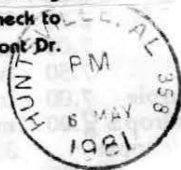

For the first time since the national points system began, there will, now, be a radical change in format. Instead of the 12-17 national tournaments around the country, there will be three major qualifying tournaments located in the west, the east and the central part of the U.S.. Since Whamo is putting up the bucks for these tourneys they will be in or near what is called a major market area. (Heavy publicity)

Along with usual five events, will be included, the Discathon. Break out your running shoes!! From each of these three big tourneys will come the top twenty in overall standings. They will be invited and participate at W.F.C. on amateur standings (no prize money). The WFC will be in July this time and may be in San Francisco, St. Louis, or Philly. (maybe).

Of course this format opens up the tourney scene for the Players' Associations to promote and sponsor their own tourneys. The Riders of the Windwill have a field event meet somewhere—maybe Huntsville and the Freestyle Players' Assn. will have a few tourneys spread around, like Rochester and Atlanta?
