The golf tourney in Sweden will be the WFDF World Championship, sponsored by the Swedish government to the tune of \$30,000. All divisions will be included and teams from 15 countries will be invited. The Frisbee clubs in Sweden are funded by the government and as Stork says, there is more organization than in the U.S. So, how do you get there? Seems the U.S. team will come from the top finishers at the PDGA World Championship in Tulsa. Now, which tourney will be a true representation of World Competition? An informal survey was conducted at the tourney, ranking the distance discs.

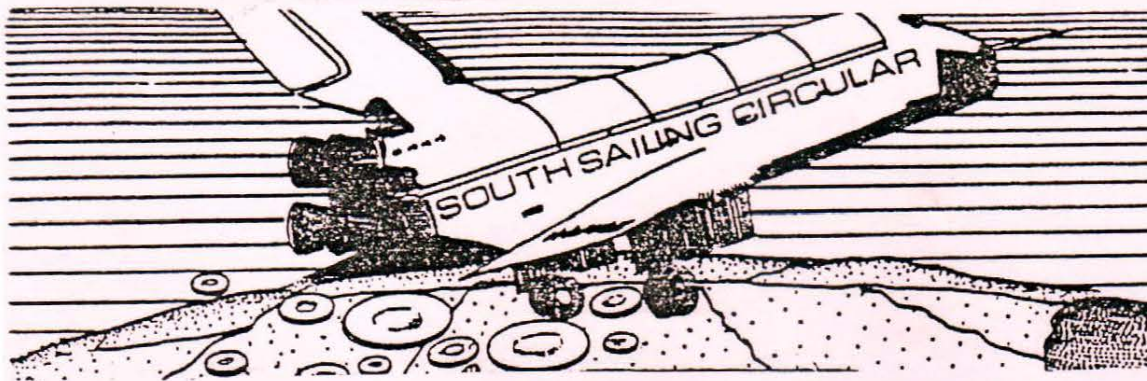

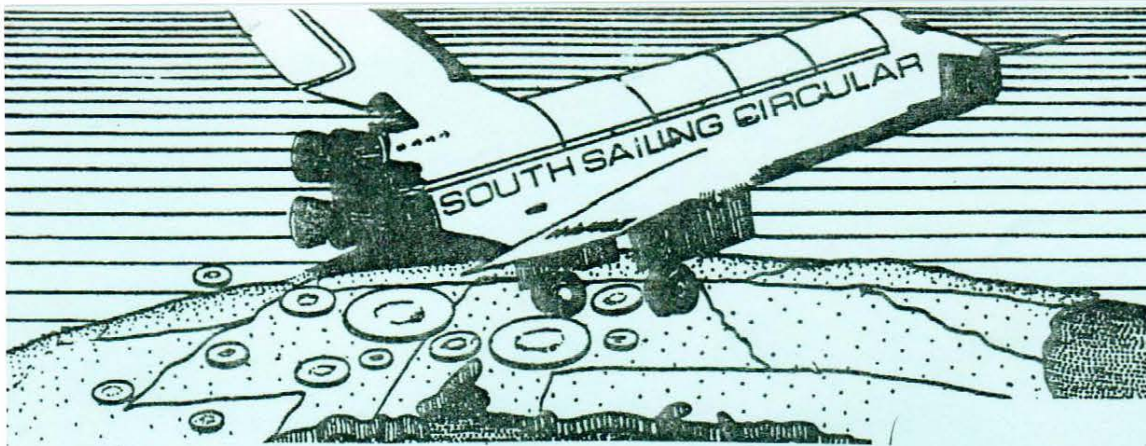
