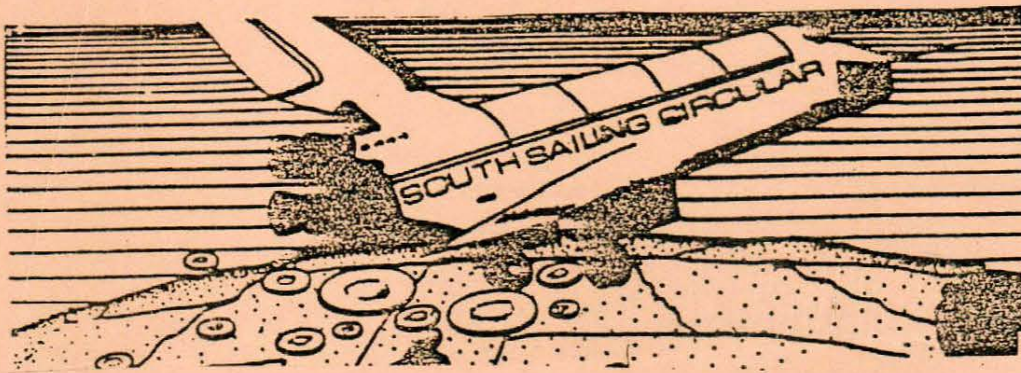

In the opening rounds John Andrews & Brett Segrest jumped into the lead, but they were challenged by Tom Monroe & Garry Augustine-the Gainesville Gang. Starting Sunday the Gang was tied for 2nd-three strokes behind Andrews. As the wind calmed and the sun came up, Monroe eased into a 9 stroke victory over Andrews. The big charge from Slasor & Watson never materialized. There were some hot battles in the Ex & Am divisions, with a couple of ties during the last rounds. In the end it was the home town favorites of Schultz & Figlor. Once again Roxanne Spencer was unchallenged for top Pro Woman.

- TALLAHASSEE MARCH 8-9, CHANGE TO MARCH 29/30.

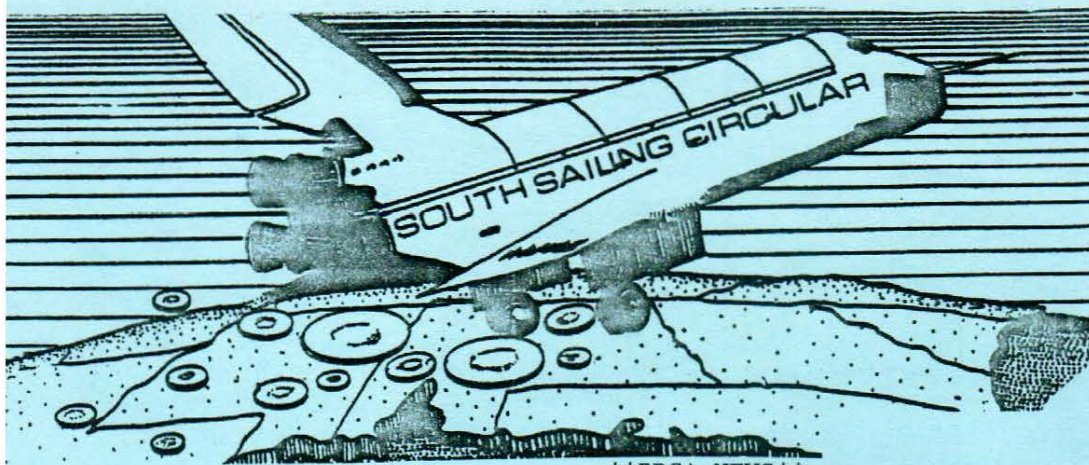

David Greenwell made the long trip so he could tie the course record of -12, with Carlton Howard at -11 in the 1st round. Those two saw their lead diminish in the final round as local's Steve Slasor & John Andrews made the grand charge to the finish. Not to be outdone by her male counterparts, Roxanne Spencer blew away her competition while setting a new course record. The expert division was tight with Dave Louderback edging out Jeff Schultz by one putt.

The Aviles Appreciation Award was presented to Pop & Ed for their 7 years of outstanding service to the Disc Golf Community.

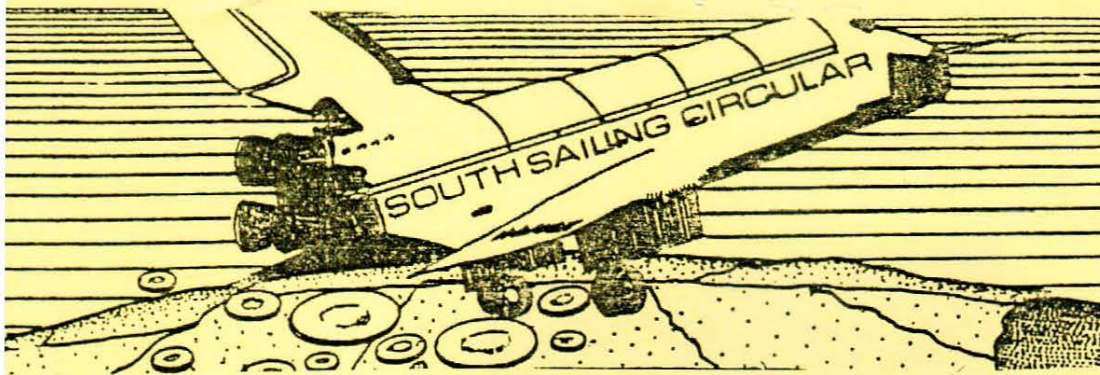

CHARLOTTE ISSUE JULY/AUGUST 1986

**THE HEADRICK CHALLENGE:** About 2 weeks before the tour was over this summer, Ed Headrick issued an incentive program. If a player were to win, place, or show, in the Open Division at a PDGA event he/she would win a new portable Mach II Pole Hole; or \$100; or \$50 worth of PGDA plastic. Of course you had to use DGA discs exclusively. At least two players won new pole holes. Lavone Wolfe on the Arsenal course in Huntsville, and Tom Monroe at the longer Northside park in Gainesville, FL. Look for a similar program at Charlotte.

**PAY FOR CHAINS:** Steve Slasor recently held a Doubles Tournament for Double Chains at Rockledge, FL. Rockledge is the oldest pay for play course in the country. The tournament raised over \$400 to pay for Mach II kits. The format was new to most players. 2 person teams played 1) Best Shot, 2) Worst Shot, 3) Alternate Shot, & 4) Combined total. Ed Aviles has kept track of all players scores and has assigned handicaps. Some teams had 20-30 stroke handicaps. It was fun for all and a good way to raise money.

**THE US OPEN:** Without a doubt the largest consistant money tournament in the World, this overall event saw some upsets and dark horses this year. As usual Dan "Stork" Roddick sets the standard for tournament production And direction. This years smooth running event saw 15 to 20,000 spectators eyeball the events. Taped by independents for syndication, you can probably watch the Open on an independent station near you next month or Sept. Scott Zimmerman wins overall but missed the golf cut. To make up for it he wins SCF with 75m TRC and 5 11+ MTA's in the final. He beat 2nd overall Harvey Brandt by 12 points. The overall winner for women was Annie Kreml of San Diego Ultimate fame. The big surprise this year was Harvey Brandt, finishing 2nd overall and if thats not enough his discmate Mandy Carriero did likewise in the womens division. Their months of practice with WhamO Ammo finally paid off. Another upset was Hiroshi Oshima from Japan winning distance with incredible arm speed. No surprise in Golf as Randy Amon wins on the home course. Thanks to Stork and his competent staff for a stellar event.

**WHO'S HOT, WHO'S NOT** Put your money down, who will win big this year? Can the California crowd cut it in Charlotte? The heat and humidity hurt them in Huntsville and Rochester (except Sam) Their numbers and the wind helped them in Tulsa. Now they are back in the steamy south. Sam Ferrans is still young enough that outside stimuli do not affect him as he proved in Sweden last summer. Snapper Pierson is always on the edge of victory if he can keep his face on. Harold Duvall is always hot. Jeff Watson has all but retired from heavy competition. The midwest and the central sates have some strong contenders, Steve Wisecup, Slate Paul, Johnny Sias, have all been there before. The South has some hopefuls starting with Dave Greenwell and Steve Slasor. The Joe Bros and Lavone Wolfe may not make it this year. This would be the first one they have missed and they will be missed by all. Tom Monroe will lead the pack from Florida which includes Garry Augustine, John Andrews, Tom Krajna, and maybe Nick Hart and Harvey Brandt.

In the Masters it could be Cap'n Snap if thats where he plays, if not John David should walk away with top honors again. The women's division will be up for grabs with Vanessa Chambers and Ramona Hale fighting off whoever shows up, including another strong contender from FL, Roxanne Spencer.

The local contingent is very strong in N.C. with Carlton Howard, Alan Beaver, & Dave Hesselberth reeking of home course advantage.

Also from Canada, Mike Sullivan will be in the running. SO...who will it be?? Close your eyes and pick one.

**\*\*HOT NEW PLASTIC:** Disc Golf Design & Sales has replaced Tom Monroe's Frisbee South. The soon to be released 'Flyin Ace' is said to be more stable than the coupe & will fly as far as the P-38. The new group will also market a utility disc called the 'Beach Jammer'.

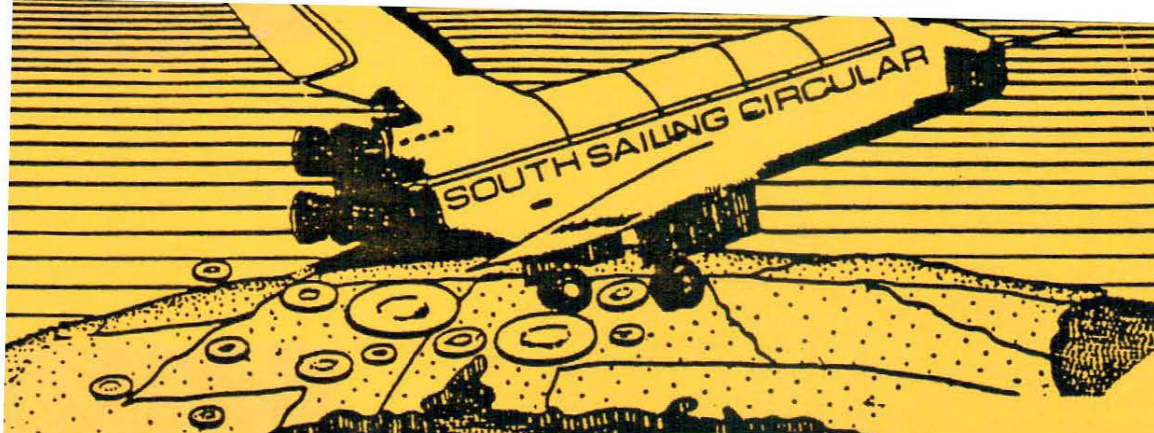
