NEW DISCS-New from Dynamic Disc the "Long Ranger", a long distance turnover disc from those Puppy people. The Ace? from Innova, a not so original name, has not been made available for testing, understand its a turnover disc. The "Falcon" from Lightning Discs, is really a turnover. Put hyzer on it and it flips over with speed.

Between the Long Ranger and the Falcon, the LR seems easier to grip and may be more controllable. The LR will break unless they have changed the plastic consistency by now. Ours broke after two weeks in the trees. The Falcon plastic seems to be very durable. It wants to turn quickly. Both discs can be thrown with hyzer and still flip over. Of course speed and height help determine the turning point. Neither disc goes straight when flown flat very far.

THE DISC GOLF MAGAZINE is finally out. This slick rag could set the standard for future disc publications. With contributions by many Americans, the Denmark based periodical places emphasis on Disc Golf around the world. Written in English, it's appeal is universal. 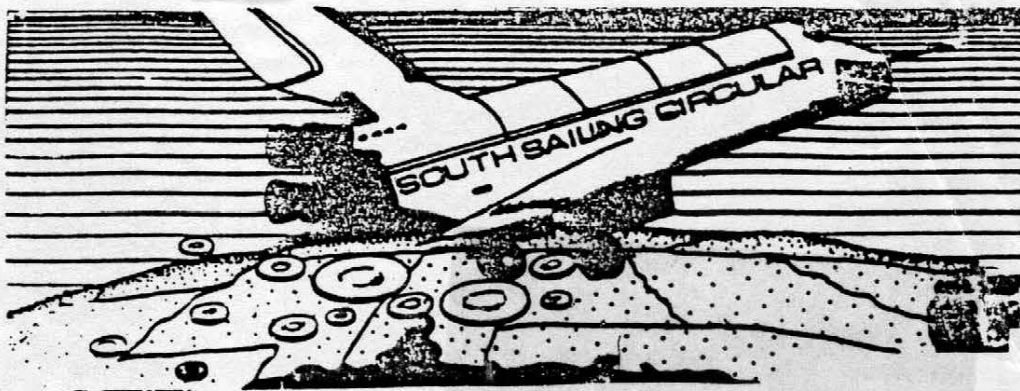

Paul fell by the wayside early, followed by Wisecup, leaving the way open for Canada's #1 golfer, Mike Sullivan, who cannot be beat on his home course. If he had just hit one of the 5 putts he missed during the round he would have won. His power drives put him on top of most of the back nine pins so that he and Gregg were tied going into the 16th hole. That's when the playoff began. Hosfeld would come up short and hit the big putt. So it went for 4 holes into a playoff where Sullivan's putt hit the outside edge of the iron chains, teetered on the edge of the basket and over she went. A dissapointing finish finish to a great round. But there was jubilation in the Hosfeld corner as team Florida jumped all over the place.

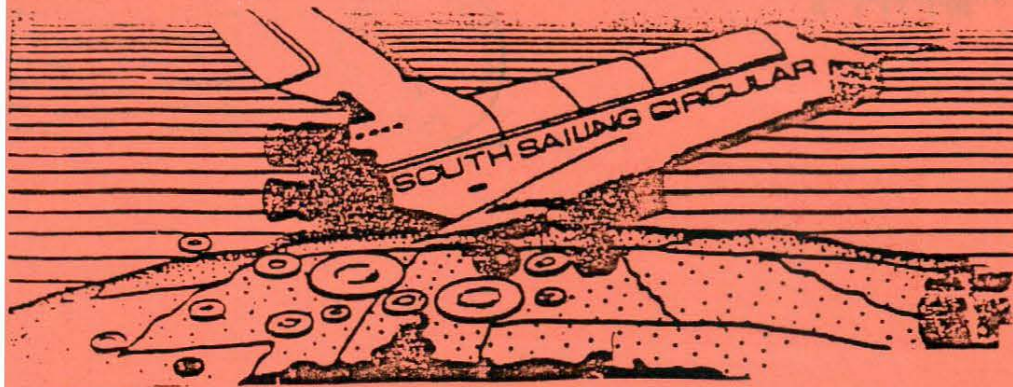

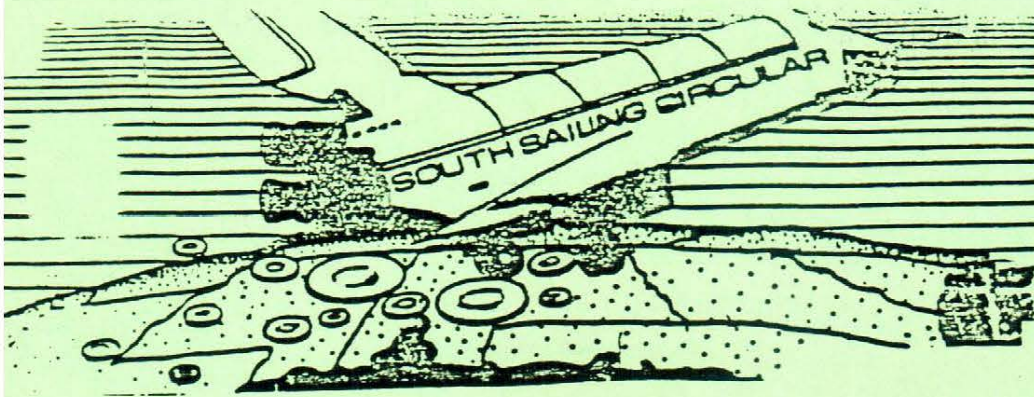
