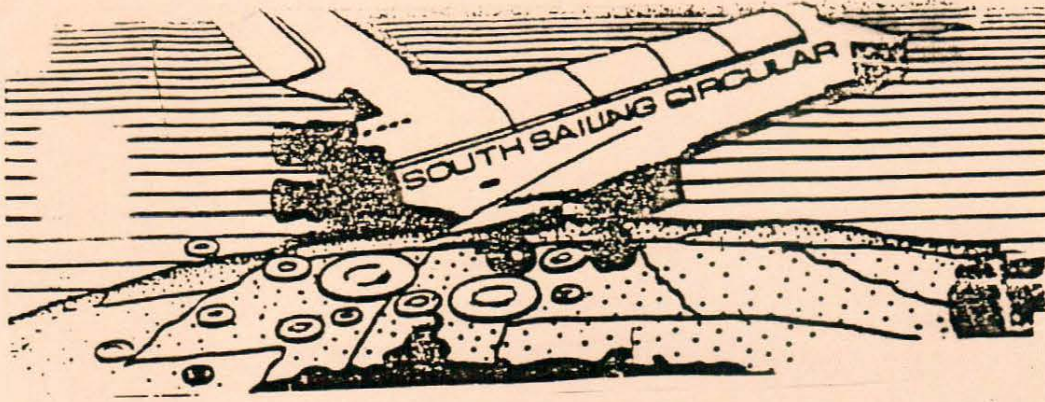

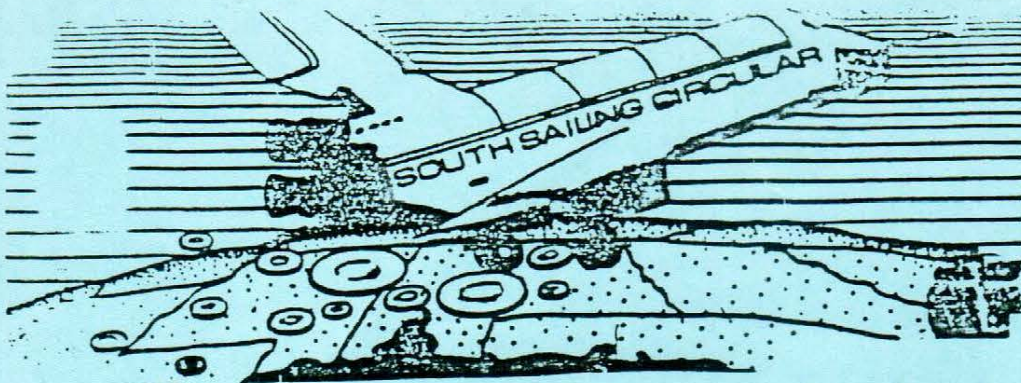

Good weather (very warm), good party, & good media coverage helped make this event one to be remembered. Even more eventful was the climatic finish. After 4 rounds of regulation play Tom Krajna was the leader in the clubhouse. The format called for the top 3 plus ties to start from scratch in a 9 hole playoff. Krajna had to drop out and settle for 5th place, and there were 4 in the playoff. The players were old guard Monroe, Slasor, Andrews; and the Rookie, Kid Kenny Climo. Andrews fell by the wayside with a bogey on the mando #3. Slaz, Monroe, and Climo were tight after 6. On the long turnover #7 the crowd went wild as Monroe missed the Ace by inches. After 8, the three were tied. On the tee shot at #9 Monroe and Slasor went wide left and right. The kid went straight up the middle. The Old Pros tied for 2nd, while the rookie from Clearwater took home the crown. It was a fine finish to a great weekend. Congratulations to Kenny Climo, Florida's Rookie of the Year.

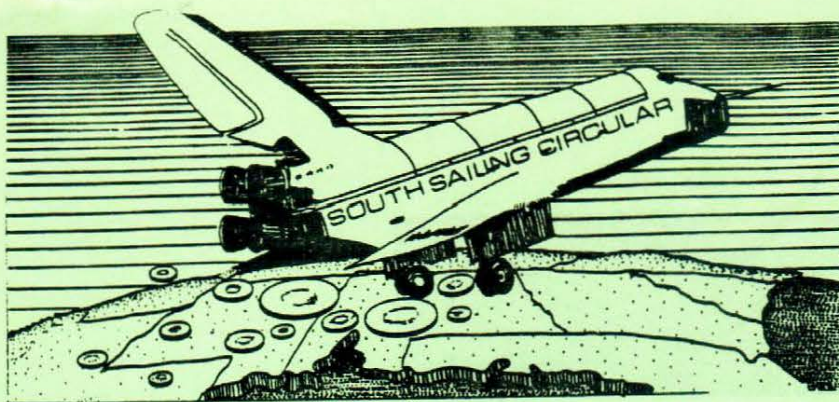
